The fifth ranked Mules (38-6, 20-3 MIAA) play their final regular season road series this weekend against Emporia State (24-17, 13-8 MIAA) at Glennen Field. The Hornets come in at third in the MIAA after dropping 3-of-4 from Northwest Missouri and taking a single game from Pittsburg on Wednesday. Central Missouri is first in the MIAA has won 11 of its last 12 games.

Mules Swing Away for Season Sweep of Bulldogs

(Kirksville, Mo.) – The No. 5 Central Missouri Mules made it 60 wins in a row over the Bulldogs of Truman State on Wednesday with a doubleheader sweep in Kirksville, 9-4 and 13-0. Central Missouri matched its total of nine home runs from first meeting at home this season. In addition, Mules pitching allowed only six hits all day.

The Mules (38-6, 20-3 MIAA) started off strong in both games, going out to 4-0 leads in the first two innings. The first half of the doubleheader started off really strong though, as second baseman Gered Mochizuki hit the second pitch of the game over the fence to left center. It would be a sign of things to come. Mochizuki, who had hit only one homer all season, jacked three on the day to lead the Mules. He hit his second of the day in the second inning, which was a two-run shot to dead center field. He drew walks on his final three at-bats of the opener.

On the mound, freshman Danny Potje got his second career start and threw 3.2 innings and allowing four runs on four hits with six walks. Closer Bryan Collins came in for the win after striking out three of the four batters he faced. Peter Davenport tossed the final two frames without allowing a hit.

In the nightcap, UCM got stellar performances on the mound all day as they allowed only two hits and collected a combined shutout. Jarod Potts started on a pre-determined split and threw the first three frames, allowing only one hit and striking out five with no walks. Travis Pyatt, Alex Kent, and Mark Carey came in to finish off the game though.

Offensively, the Mules were led by Iain Dykins and Josh Paul, each of which drove in three runs and

had homers. Paul's jack was a three-run shot in the first inning and was his second shot of the day. Also knocking two out of the park was left fielder Nick Jaros, who hit one in each game. UCM pounded out 13 hits in the outing to earn its sixth shutout of the season.



The Coaches

Head Coach **Darin Hendrickson** is in his fourth season with University of Central Missouri baseball program. Named the Mules' 12th head coach in the summer of 2003, Hendrickson has now put his stamp on one of the top baseball teams in NCAA Division II. The 37-year-old native of Granite City, Ill. has compiled a 196-39 record in his fourth season at the helm.

He has a career NCAA record of 322-93, including his four seasons at Fontbonne, and has had nine players picked in the Major League Draft in his three seasons at Central Missouri.

Bob Fornelli is in his fourth season at Emporia State and has led them to a 149-71 overall mark. Last year, he led the Hornets to the MIAA title, the Central Region title, and the Division II World Series with a 48-13 record.

The Series

The Mules lead the Hornets by a 75-29 overall record and defeated them in five of the seven meetings last season. The Mules have won the last two games in the series after taking two in the MIAA Championship series of the conference tournament in Manhattan, Kansas last year. The last time UCM faced ESU at Glennen Field was in 2005 when the Mules swept the Hornets in a three-game set. Central Missouri has won the last eight meetings on the road at Emporia.

Scouting the Hornets

The Hornets come in ranked fifth in the first official regional poll of the season. They are led by Connor Crumbliss with a .388 batting average and 57 hits. Keith Hernandez and returning All-American Mark McBratney are the leading RBI men with 50 and 44, respectively. As a team the Hornets rank fourth in hitting and sixth in pitching. ESU has four left-handed starters and are led by Trent Lare with a 3.30 ERA and a 4-3 record. Mickey Lara (3-2) and righthander Brock Nehls (4-3) are second and third in the rotation.

Hendrickson Hits Milestones

Head Coach Darin Hendrickson is now ranked third on the all-time win list at UCM after passing Stu Rogers this season. He now sits with 196 victories as a Mule and is chasing the late Bob Tompkins, who racked up 248 during his 15-year career. Hendrickson also has the best winning percentage of any coach in school history at an outstanding 83.4 percent (196-39).

Mules Baseball: Winningest Team of the Millenium

The University of Central Missouri baseball program has had unprecedented success in the last 20 years and has been even more impressive since 2000. With the win over FHSU Sunday, UCM has a 404-78 overall record since 2000, the most wins of any program in NCAA Division I, II, or III.

Mules: Defending the Home Turf

The Mules are currently riding a 22-game home winning streak at Crane Stadium. It is the longest current streak in the MIAA. Mules athletics have also teamed up for an exciting streak. No Mules team sport has lost a home game since the wrestlers on February 8 to top-ranked Central Oklahoma.

On a side note, no team has lost a home game with Shawn Jones as the play-by-play voice since football dropped to second-ranked Northwest Missouri on October 28.

Mule Kick Row

The trio of Iain Dykins, Josh Paul, and Nick Jaros is a menacing task for any opposing pitcher. Between these three, four, and five hole hitters, they have hit 31 home runs and knocked in 126 RBI. The three-man home run total is better than nine of the 10 teams in the MIAA this year. Against Truman on Wednesday, they hit five homers.

The Long Ball

Senior first baseman Josh Paul is tied for ninth in a single season (14) and a career (25) for home runs at UCM. The single season record is 20 by Ben Slemmer (1998).

Maui Time

Central Missouri leadoff hitter and second baseman **Gered Mochizuki** leads the 5th ranked Mules with a .412 batting average, 63 hits, 49 runs, 15 doubles, 41 walks, 15 stolen bases, and a .541 on-base percentage. He is the only returning All-American and leads the MIAA in total hits, walks, on base percentage, and runs. Against Truman on Wednesday, he hit three home runs in the doubleheader. He had only hit one all season until then.

Back on Top in the MIAA

The Mules currently lead the MIAA with a .338 batting average, 25 triples, 53 home runs, 486 hits, and 73 stolen bases. They really dominate the league in pitching though. With a team ERA of 2.86, the next closest team is NWMSU at 4.39. Central Missouri leads the conference in every major statistical category for pitching.

Dirty Rotation

The Central Missouri Mules baseball squad has returned to form on the mound after the 2005 Major League Draft took five pitchers. The top five starters in 2007 have ERA's under 4.0 with the top two combining for a 16-1 record. Starter **Seth Gilleland** (9-0) has been named MIAA Pitcher of the Week two times while **Kris Webber** (7-1) has been named once. They are ranked one and two in the MIAA in pitching as Gilleland boasts a 2.17 ERA and Webber with a 1.84 average.

Closer **Bryan Collins** has four saves and a 0.79 ERA while set up man/closer **Chris Radliff** has a 0.98 ERA and three saves along with three wins and was named the MIAA Pitcher of the Week last Tuesday. Meanwhile, **Brandon Morris**, who has been out due to injury, has a perfect 4-0 record this season, adding to his MIAA Freshman of the Year season of 9-0 last year.

National Leaders

The Mules also have several players ranked on the national scene in Division II as of April 8. The team ERA of 2.67 ranks fourth in the nation, the strikeouts

per game of 9.0 ranks third, and the Mules winning percentage of .872 is fifth.

Individually, Seth Gilleland and Kris Webber are ranked third and 11th in the nation in wins while Blaine Rutledge is seventh in triples per game at .20. Josh Paul is also 16th in home runs with 11.

Driving Dykins

Junior third baseman Iain Dykins has been an RBI machine for the Mules the last five games. He has hit five home runs and 11 RBI in the stretch. He smacked a couple two-run shots in the Saturday night game and had what would turn out to be the game-winner on a two-run jack in the first game on Sunday against Fort Hays to break a 3-3 tie in the top of the seventh of a seven-frame game.

Late Inning Defense

The Mules have outscored the opposition overall in every inning this year. Even better, they have virtually shut down their opponents in the seventh, eighth, ninth, and extra innings. The largest gap is in the fourth inning where the Mules have outscored their opponents 55-16. The biggest trouble area has been the sixth frame as they have allowed 33 runs and scored 54.

Goin' Streaking!

The Mules have used several team and individual streaks to get to their 38-6 overall record. The longest winning streak of the season was 14 games earlier this year. One thing they have not had is a losing streak. At no point during the season have the Mules lost two consecutive games.

Individually, junior Bryan McBryde has had the longest hitting streak of the season at 13 games. Junior Blaine Rutledge had the second longest streak at 12 game while Gered Mochizuki and Clay Weatherford each had streaks of 10. The longest current streak on the squad is a tie between Luis Perez and Josh Paul at five each.
