### The Games:

The fifth ranked Mules (36-6, 18-3 MIAA) continue their road swing of nine games on Wednesday when they take on Truman (7-26, 3-15 MIAA) for the final two times this season. The Bulldogs are in last place in the MIAA but have taken wins from Missouri Western, Fort Hays, and Missouri Southern.

### Mules take two-of-three from Tigers

(Hays, Kan.) – After several schedule changes, the Mules and Tigers finally got on the field late Saturday night and fourth ranked Central Missouri didn't disappoint, taking two-of-three from Fort Hays State at Larks Park over the weekend. UCM took the first two games 18-6 and 5-3 before FHSU grabbed the final game, 7-5.

Central Missouri (36-6, 18-3 MIAA) pounded out 17 hits and 18 runs in the opening game of the series with the bulk of that coming in a 10-run sixth frame. Iain Dykins and Chris Brown had big days with each knocking in four runs. Dykins hit a couple two-run homers in the outing while Dykins was 3-for-3 with a walk. Travis Pyatt got the start for Central Missouri but only threw the first two innings before Jarod Potts came in for the next 3.1 frames to grab the win.

On Sunday, Seth Gilleland started game one for UCM, keeping the Tigers at bay with three runs. He threw into the seventh inning and moved to 9-0 on the year. Dykins was the hero though, hitting a two-run homer in the top of the seventh to break a 3-3 tie. Brian McBryde led the attack with a three-of-three performance. Chris Radliff came in the game to pitch the final frame after one runner reached in the seventh. He earned the save by keeping the Tigers scoreless in the inning.

The Tigers got the Mules back in the final game of the day though. UCM made a comeback attempt in the final two frames but fell just short. After cutting the lead to 7-5, UCM had two men on base with two outs and the hot-hitting Dykins at the plate but FHSU closer Tyler Nuss recorded the strikeout to preserve the win. Will Feil and Dykins were the leading Mule hitters in the game going 3-of-4 and 2-of-5, respectively.

## The Coaches

Head Coach **Darin Hendrickson** is in his fourth season with University of Central Missouri baseball program. Named the Mules' 12th head coach in the summer of 2003, Hendrickson has now put his stamp on one of the top baseball teams in NCAA Division II. The 37-year-old native of Granite City, Ill. has compiled a 194-39 record in his fourth season at the helm.

He has a career NCAA record of 320-93, including his four seasons at Fontbonne, and has had nine players picked in the Major League Draft in his three seasons at Central Missouri.

**Dan Davis** is in his first season as head coach at Truman after serving as the pitching coach for the University of Northern Iowa for the last six seasons. While there, he coached the Missouri Valley Pitcher of the Year and helped lower the team ERA from eight in his first season to just more than four last year.

## The Series

The Mules lead the Bulldogs 109-19 and have won the last 58 games in the overall series. The last time Truman defeated the Mules was April 6, 1988 by an 11-7 margin. Central Missouri knocked off the Bulldogs by scores of 18-5 and 13-4 in Warrensburg earlier this season.

## Scouting the Bulldogs

Truman comes in after splitting a two-game set with Missouri Southern. They hit .254 as a team and have a staff ERA of 7.62. Only one player, catcher Matt Over, hits above 300 on the team. He maintains a .358 average and has 15 RBI. A.J. Barton leads the pitching staff with a 2-1 record and a 2.83 ERA. He defeated Fort Hays last week by a 2-1 margin and was named MIAA Co-Pitcher of the Week.

## Hendrickson Hits Milestones

Head Coach Darin Hendrickson is now ranked third on the all-time win list at UCM after passing Stu Rogers this season. He now sits with 194 victories as a Mule and is chasing the late Bob Tompkins, who racked up 248 during his 15-year career. Hendrickson also has the best winning percentage of any coach in school history at an outstanding 83.5 percent (194-39).

## Mules Baseball: Winningest Team of the Millenium

The University of Central Missouri baseball program has had unprecedented success in the last 20 years and has been even more impressive since 2000. With the win over FHSU Sunday, UCM has a 402-78 overall record since 2000, the most wins of any program in NCAA Division I, II, or III.

## Mules: Defending the Home Turf

The Mules are currently riding a 22-game home winning streak at Crane Stadium. It is the longest current streak in the MIAA. Mules athletics have also teamed up for an exciting streak. No Mules team sport has lost a home game since the wrestlers on February 8 to top-ranked Central Oklahoma.

On a side note, no team has lost a home game with Shawn Jones as the play-by-play voice since football dropped to second-ranked Northwest Missouri on October 28.

## Going, Going...Gone!!

Mules senior first baseman **Josh Paul** was named the Louisville Slugger National Player of the Week after his hitting display last week. He hit .696 in the six games with six home runs and an amazing 19 RBI. He was the only non-Division I player to receive the honor.

The last Central Missouri player to receive the honor was Danny Powers back in the record breaking 2005 season.

He helped the fifth ranked Mules to a 6-0 record last week. Paul actually hit nine home runs in a seven game stretch counting three games at Missouri Western last weekend.

He hit three home runs in a game against Truman on Tuesday after hitting one in the first game of that day. He is the first person since National Position Player of the Year Shawn Callahan in 2005 to hit three homers in a game.

Paul also knocked in eight RBI and tied a school record with five hits against SBU on Friday night. He ended that game on a two run "walk off" homer to run rule the Bearcats 17-6. For the week, he had an on base percentage of .750 and a slugging percentage of an amazing 1.696.

### *Maui Time*

Central Missouri leadoff hitter and second baseman **Gered Mochizuki** leads the 4th ranked Mules with a .403 batting average, 60 hits, 44 runs, 15 doubles, 37 walks, 15 stolen bases, and a .527 on-base percentage. He is the only returning All-American and leads the MIAA in total hits, walks, on base percentage, and runs.

### *Back on Top in the MIAA*

The Mules currently lead the MIAA with a .335 batting average, 25 triples, 44 home runs, 461 hits, and 69 stolen bases. They really dominate the league in pitching though. With a team ERA of 2.87, the next closest team is NWMSU at 4.39. Central Missouri leads the conference in every major statistical category for pitching.

### *Dirty Rotation*

The Central Missouri Mules baseball squad has returned to form on the mound after the 2005 Major League Draft took five pitchers. The top five starters in 2007 have ERA's under 4.0 with the top two combining for a 16-1 record. Starter **Seth Gilleland** (9-0) has been named MIAA Pitcher of the Week two times while **Kris Webber** (7-1) has been named once. They are ranked one and two in the MIAA in pitching as Gilleland boasts a 2.17 ERA and Webber with a 1.84 average.

Closer **Bryan Collins** has four saves and a 0.84 ERA while set up man/closer **Chris Radliff** has a 0.98 ERA and three saves along with three wins and was named the MIAA Pitcher of the Week last Tuesday. Meanwhile, **Brandon Morris**, who has been out due to injury, has a perfect 4-0 record this season, adding to his MIAA Freshman of the Year season of 9-0 last year.

### *National Leaders*

The Mules also have several players ranked on the national scene in Division II as of April 8. The team ERA of 2.67 ranks fourth in the nation, the strikeouts per game of 9.0 ranks third, and the Mules winning percentage of .872 is fifth.

Individually, Seth Gilleland and Kris Webber are ranked third and 11th in the nation in wins while Blaine Rutledge is seventh in triples per game at .20. Josh Paul is also 16th in home runs with 11.

### *Driving Dykins*

Junior third baseman Iain Dykins had a big weekend for the Mules against Fort Hays State. He had four home runs and eight RBI in the three game series. He smacked a couple two-run shots in the Saturday night game and had what would turn out to be the game-winner on a two-run jack in the first game on Sunday to break a 3-3 tie in the top of the seventh of a seven-frame game.

### *Late Inning Defense*

The Mules have outscored the opposition overall in every inning this year. Even better, they have virtually shut down their opponents in the seventh, eighth, ninth, and extra innings. The largest gap is in the fourth inning where the Mules have outscored their opponents 51-13. The biggest trouble area has been the sixth frame as they have allowed 33 runs and scored 49.

### *Goin' Streaking!*

The Mules have used several team and individual streaks to get to their 36-6 overall record. The longest winning streak of the season was 14 games earlier this year. One thing they have not had is a losing streak. At no point during the season have the Mules lost two consecutive games.

Individually, junior Bryan McBryde has had the longest hitting streak of the season at 13 games. Junior Blaine Rutledge had the second longest streak at 12 game while Gered Mochizuki and Clay Weatherford each had streaks of 10. The longest current streak on the squad is sophomore Will Feil at nine.
