The Game:

The Mules (14-0, 5-0 MIAA) will host Fort Hays State (8-7, 1-5 MIAA) after an eight-day layoff on Thursday at the Multi for the first ever meeting between the teams in MIAA play. Central Missouri comes in ranked No. 3 in the nation and have won 14 straight while the Tigers are coming in after their first MIAA win at home against Missouri Western.

Mules blow past Griffons with balanced attack, 90-70

(WARRENSBURG, Mo.) – The University of Central Missouri Mules made it 14 in a row to start the season with a balanced attack and blazing three-point shooting against the Missouri Western Griffons, 90-70 last Wednesday night at the Multi.

Central Missouri (14-0, 5-0 MIAA) was 14-of-21 from three-point land (66.7 percent) and out-rebounded the Griffons (8-6, 1-4 MIAA) 38-33. The Mules made more free throws (22) than the Griffons attempted (19) as well, keeping with a trend they have practiced all season.

UCM opened the game on a 10-2 run and never looked back as the Griffons could only get to within five by the 12:54 mark of the first period. The Mules pushed their advantage to 11 with a couple threes from Fred Dudley and Zack Wright and held until the 2:41 mark before making their move. Central Missouri closed the stanza on a 9-2 run to go into the break with their largest lead of the night at 40-24. The Mules did all this despite turning it over 13 times in the period compared to MWSU's seven. Darryl Sommerset started a career night with a game-high nine rebounds and 10 points in the half. J.R. Reed paced Missouri Western with 10 as well at the break.

UCM stormed out of the gates in the second period with a four-point play from Theo Jones, hitting the trifecta and getting fouled by Reed. Jones would follow with another three less than a minute later to give Central Missouri a 24-point advantage by the 18:22 mark. The closest Missouri Western would get the rest of the way was 15 while the Mules had a 26-point margin on a couple occasions during the outing.

The Mules out-shot the Griffons 51.9-to-41.3 in the game.

Central Missouri had a season-high six players in double-figures but was led by Sommerset's 20 points and career-high 14 rebounds on the night. Jones and Wright each had 15 along with six and five assists, respectively. Wadale Williams was perfect from three-point land with a 4-of-4 performance for 12 points while Dudley tacked on 10 points and a career-high five assists. Alonzo Brooks rounded out the scoring with 12. Missouri Western had four players in double-figures, led by Reed with 13.

Home court advantage

With the win over Missouri Western, Central Missouri is 35-3 at the Multipurpose Building in the last three seasons under Anderson. They have a 22-0 record against non-conference opponents at home during that span as well. Against MIAA teams, the Mules are 17-3 at home in the last three years.

They have won their last 14 games at the Multi (5th longest streak in the nation) dating back to a loss to Emporia on January 14 of last season (complete list on pg. 7). They have won eight in a row against MIAA competition.

Winning Big Time

The Mules lead the MIAA and rank second in the nation with a 23.1 average margin of victory in their games this season. They have also defeated their five MIAA opponents by an average of 16.8 points per game, defeating Pittsburg State by 20, Washburn by 17, Southwest Baptist by 11, Missouri Southern by 16, and Missouri Western by 20. The closest game of the season was against Rollins in Las Vegas at seven. That is the only single-digit victory of the year though.

In addition, Central Missouri has held at least a 13 point advantage in every game it has played.

We're Number Three!!

The Mules No. 3 ranking is the highest UCM has been since January of 1985 when they were ranked second in the nation. That year, the Mules started 11-0 and set the school record for consecutive wins with 26 after winning the national title and final 15 games of 1984.

Anderson moving up the coaching charts

Mules head coach Kim Anderson got win number 93 against MWSU on Wednesday, just part of the way into his fifth season. He is fifth place on the UCM coaching list (out of 23 coaches) with a 93-40 mark. Up next on the list is Lynn Nance, who was an outstanding 114-35 in five seasons from 1980-85.

And then there were Five

The Mules are one of five teams left in Division II with an undefeated record. Winona State, Clayton State, Bentley, and Emporia State are the other four (longest winning streaks and records on pg. 7).

Mules Basketball All-Time

Central Missouri Mules basketball is in its 101st season. The Mules have produced an all-time record of 1434-869. The Mules are the second winningest program in NCAA Division II basketball history (trailing only Central Washington).

Central Missouri has won three national titles--the NAIB titles in 1936-37 (the first ever collegiate basketball championship) and 1937-38, and the NCAA-II title in 1984.

The Mules have also claimed 15 regular season conference titles (the most of any modern-day MIAA team), three MIAA tournament crowns, and have advanced to the NCAA Tournament 18 times.

(Las Vegas, Nev.) - Third-ranked University of Central Missouri celebrated its highest ranking since 1985 with a 71-60 win over fourth-ranked Seattle Pacific on Friday night in the Las Vegas High Desert Classic. The Mules 8-0 start is also their best since the 1995-96 season when they went 10-0.

The Mules used a 10-0 run to start the game and put the Falcons (4-3) back on their heels early. They would lead most of the first half but Seattle Pacific forced back-to-back turnovers and turned a four-point deficit into a two-point lead with 40 seconds remaining. The Falcons would take a 33-31 advantage into the break. The entire period was plagued with turnovers as Central Missouri committed 15 and SPU had 13.

Zack Wright led all scorers at the half with eight while Dustin Bremerman had seven for SPU.

The second stanza started off with the Mules taking a small lead but it got rocky from there as Wright and Wadale Williams each got their third foul and had to sit down. Theo Jones picked up the slack though. With 12:02 remaining, he hit a shot falling away and was fouled by Bremerman for an old-fashioned three-point play that put the Mules up by six. SPU cut it back to three but Jones answered with a couple made free throws and followed that with a three-pointer with 8:21 left to give the Mules an eight-point advantage and control.

The Mules would go up by as much as 13 down the stretch as they kept attacking the rim and getting to the free throw line, taking advantage of the spot-shooting Falcons. The Mules hit 30-of-41 free throw attempts while SPU cooled off from the field in the second half, hitting only 33 percent compared to 50 in the opening period. Both teams took care of the ball better in the second as UCM had only five turnovers and the Falcons gave it away nine times.

Wright fouled out after playing only seven minutes in the stanza but the rest of the Mules picked up the pace. Besides the free throw advantage, UCM also out-rebounded the Falcons 44-29, including 18 on the offensive end. Darryl Sommerset pulled down a game-high 11 boards while Alonzo Brooks grabbed seven.

Central Missouri was led by four players in double-figures. Jones had 15, Brooks and Williams finished with 14, and Wright had 10. Bremerman paced the Falcons with 17.

(WARRENSBURG, Mo.) – The University of Central Missouri Mules made it 14 in a row to start the season with a balanced attack and blazing three-point shooting against the Missouri Western Griffons, 90-70 on Wednesday night at the Multi.

Central Missouri (14-0, 5-0 MIAA) was 14-of-21 from three-point land (66.7 percent) and out-rebounded the Griffons (8-6, 1-4 MIAA) 38-33. The Mules made more free throws (22) than the Griffons attempted (19) as well, keeping with a trend they practiced all season.

UCM opened the game on a 10-2 run and never looked back as the Griffons could only get to within five by the 12:54 mark of the first period. The Mules pushed their advantage to 11 with a couple threes from Fred Dudley and Zack Wright and held until the 2:41 mark before making their move. Central Missouri closed the stanza on a 9-2 run to go into the break with their largest lead of the night at 40-24. The Mules did all this despite turning it over 13 times in the period compared to MWSU's seven. Darryl Sommerset started a career night with a game-high nine rebounds and 10 points in the half. J.R. Reed paced Missouri Western with 10 as well at the break.

UCM stormed out of the gates in the second period with a four-point play from Theo Jones, hitting the trifecta and getting fouled by Reed. Jones would follow with another three less than a minute later to give Central Missouri a 24-point advantage by the 18:22 mark. The closest Missouri Western would get the rest of the way was 15 while the Mules had a 26-point margin on a couple occasions during the outing.

The Mules out-shot the Griffons 51.9-to-41.3 in the game.

Central Missouri had a season-high six players in double-figures but was led by Sommerset's 20 points and career-high 14 rebounds on the night. Jones and Wright each had 15 along with six and five assists, respectively. Wadale Williams was perfect from three-point land with a 4-of-4 performance for 12 points while Dudley tacked on 10 points and a career-high five assists. Alonzo Brooks rounded out the scoring with 12. Missouri Western had four players in double-figures, led by Reed with 13.
