The Coaches

Entering his fifth season at the University of Central Missouri, **Kim Anderson** has moved into elite company. He has led the Mules to a 79-40 overall record and is only the second coach in school history to win 24 games in back-to-back seasons (Jim Wooldridge being the other). During the past three seasons, the Mules are also the winningest team in the MIAA, posting 66 victories.

Last season, he guided the Mules to their **first NCAA Tournament win since 1996** and posted a 24-8 overall record and a second-place finish in the MIAA (11-5). **He also coached the eighth All-American in UCM history, Michael Hicks. With the signing of a contract with ALM Evreux (France) this summer, Hicks became the first Mule to play professionally since 1995 (Armando Becker).**



In 2004-05 he led the Mules to a record of 24-7, a **share of their first MIAA regular season title since 1984-85, and UCM's first men's MIAA Tournament Championship since 1983-84.** For his effort, Anderson was named **Wilson/MIAA Coach of the Year.**

Jeff Capel, a 1997 graduate of Duke University, is in his first season at the University of Oklahoma. He came to Norman after a stint at Virginia-Commonwealth, where he compiled a record of 79-41.

The Series

This is the fifth meeting between Central Missouri and Oklahoma and the series is tied 2-2. The last time the two met was back in the Mules National Championship season of 1984. OU handed UCM its first of three losses on the season by a 90-50 margin. The Sooners were led by head coach Billy Tubbs and an All-American named Wayman Tisdale.

The Mules lost only one game to a Division II opponent (Northwest Missouri) that season as the other loss came against Oklahoma State.

2006-07 Central Missouri Season Preview

The University of Central Missouri Mules have had consecutive seasons of 24 wins and berths in the NCAA Tournament. The 2006-07 team hopes to continue that tradition, but will have to do so with a new group of student-athletes.

"We had significant losses from a year ago." Said Mules Head Coach Kim Anderson, "Any time you lose an All-American like Mike Hicks and players like Corey Brown, David Hilliard and Dwight Williams, guys that have been in the program for a while, you know you have a lot of work to do."

And work they did. The Central Missouri coaching staff brought in seven newcomers for the upcoming season to add to the eight returnees from a year ago.

"I think this year's team has a solid mix of players that have been in the program a year or two, but we are going to have to rely on newcomers since we lost 51 percent of our scoring from last year. How good we are is going to depend on how well this group mixes with the returnees," Said Anderson.

The Mules have a different type of team from a year ago. After a potent outside game dominated the scoring in 2005-

06, the Mules have turned to a more balanced approach.

"We really think that we have enhanced our inside play from a year ago," Anderson said. "Of course, Alonzo Brooks, an All-MIAA pick, returns but we have also added two guys with some size and strength that will help us compete better on the inside. That is Michael Taylor and Tyler DeClue."

Brooks was second on the team in scoring last season at 11.4 points per outing and will welcome a couple more big bodies to the lineup. DeClue, a 6-9 freshman, redshirted last season after going to the Naval Prep Academy while Taylor, also 6-9, transferred in from Sheridan College in Wyoming, where he helped his team to a 30-4 record and a regional title.

"Paul Banister returns and Darryl Sommerset comes back for his senior year," Anderson said. "Sommerset is a guy that can play both inside and outside at 6-9."

Banister saw action in eight games last fall while Sommerset averaged 5.3 points and 3.3 rebounds in 30 games.

The guard position was the biggest emphasis for the Mules in the offseason, but they have some guys back that know the system and the program to ease the pain.

"Wadale Williams, a young man that started for us most of the year at the point, was an all-league honorable mention player that averaged in double figures. We are going to rely on him to make our offense move," Anderson said. "The other guy coming back is Theo Jones. He was granted another year by the NCAA due to a hardship situation and was on the all-league defensive team. He shoots the basketball well and I think those two are the guys that we will look to the most from the guard spot."

Williams led the offense with 143 assists and paced the defense with 62 steals while Jones hit 45.9 percent of his three-point attempts (39-of-85).

The players that will have to step in and help include Division I senior transfer, Zack Wright, from the University of Arkansas-Little Rock, and juniorcollege transfer Fred Dudley, from Kirkwood Community College. Dudley came to campus late because of some family obligations.

"Zack is an outstanding athlete," Anderson said. "He was a very solid player at Little Rock, and was all-conference in the Sun Belt. He is a guy that can come in and help us immediately. Fred will play almost exclusively at the guard position. Because of his late entrance, how well he learns will determine how much playing time he gets."

Other contributors at the guard spot include returnees Nathan Frazier and Victor Lee along with a newcomer in Tyler Richardson. Both Frazier and Lee saw action in six contests last season. Richardson is one of two freshmen on the squad, playing at Springfield Kickapoo High School last year.

"Nate played early for us last year and then was injured, he has really improved and done a great job for us in the preseason workouts," Anderson said. "Tyler is a very solid shooter and basketball player but he has been injured and it will depend on how well he rehabs to get on the court."

The best teams always have some utility-type players as well. The Mules are no exception to that as they have a trio of guys that they think can fill that role

"We have three men that are combination guard/forward type players," Anderson said. "Charles Stoker is the returner, he is a guy that is an opportunistic type scorer and a very good rebounder, especially offensively. He also plays good defense. Kevin Wollbrinck is a very strong player that can post up and shoot the three-point shot."

Wollbrinck transferred from St. Louis Community College at Meramec while the other forward, Kyle Weymuth, came to UCM from State Fair Community College.

There are several points that coach Anderson and staff think will be keys to their success this season, none being more important than their ability to shut opposing offenses.

"The strength of this year's team will be on defense," Anderson said. "I think we are very athletic at the guard spot with Wadale, Theo, and Zack. Our inside defense will be better over time with these bigger guys on the floor but we will definitely be strongest in the back court."

The offensive end of the floor has some strengths as well, but it will have to see the returnees step up and newcomers make an impact. Last year, the Mules put up 78 points per contest, ranking among the league leaders.

"Offensively, I think we will be a team that can get the ball to the basket and be strong on the offensive boards," Anderson said. "Anytime you lose a guy like Hicks with an automatic 20 points every night, it remains to be seen how well we will shoot the basketball. We have guys that can do it, and if we get them in the right spots, we will be a good shooting team."

The Mules set high expectations for themselves every season, and with the success of recent years, it will be no different in 2006-07.

"You know every year we start out with the goal of winning the MIAA and and post-season tournament and advancing to the national tournament. This year's team is capable of doing those things but it is going to depend on how well we play together," Anderson said.

Along the way though, Central Missouri will have to deal with one of the toughest conferences in Division II. Last season, the MIAA sent four teams to the NCAA Tournament, three of which advanced to the second round. According to Anderson, this year's conference race will be as close as ever.

"We have the ingredients to be a successful team in this league but there are a lot of other teams that have those same ingredients," Anderson said. "I think how hard we work and how much energy we play with, along with consistency will be the difference."

Central Missouri kicks off the 2006-07 campaign on November 5 with an exhibition at the University of Oklahoma in Norman. The home opener is slated for November 18 against an NAIA team in Monmouth.

Some key non conference games include the annual trip to the High Desert Classic in Las Vegas, where they play national power Seattle Pacific on December 15 and preseason nationally ranked Rollins of Florida.

Conference play starts on December 9 with Pittsburg State in Warrensburg.
