### Mules fall in 19 inning record breaker, 6-5

(Sauget, Ill.) – The Central Missouri Mules started their game with Sonoma State at 8:08 p.m. and six hours and 45 minutes later, they dropped a 6-5 heartbreaker that set school and MIAA records, going 19 innings. They missed too many opportunities on offense in the outing that finished around 3:00 a.m. at GCS Ballpark.

The Mules (46-16) defense and pitching was spectacular though, holding the Seawolves scoreless from the fifth through the 17th inning.

As with the first round, the Mules had to come from behind, giving up four early runs in the first four frames. They got it started with three in the sixth on RBI singles from Mike Hallam and Clay Weatherford. Central Missouri again struck in the bottom of the eighth with an RBI single from Weatherford to score Hallam, tying the game at four.

Those scoreless frames put up by the Mules came courtesy of sophomore Alex Kent and junior Chris Matlock on the mound. Kent tossed the fifth to the ninth, allowing only one hit, while Matlock went 9.1 innings, allowing only three hits and striking out 13. The Central Missouri pitching staff set an MIAA and school record with 22 K's in the game as well.

Sonoma got a solid relief performance from Matt Garnett, who tossed seven innings and gave up only one run on five hits.

The Mules offensive woes included several missed bunts, three pick-offs on the base paths and some good pitching by the Seawolves. The Mules left a season-high 16 men on base in the game.

The Mules almost won it in the bottom of the 17th when Balin Bergman crushed a long ball down the

left field fence that went inches foul to preserve SSU's chances.

The drama really got started in the 18th as Sonoma's Dave Herman homered off Tom Latimore to left, putting the Seawolves up 5-4. Central Missouri got out of the frame thanks to Nick Phillips, but had to score in the bottom half.

Score the Mules did, starting it off with a double to center from Hallam. Jon Wegener pinch ran for him, advanced to third on a wild pitch, and scored on a sacrifice bunt from Weatherford for his third RBI of the night. He reached on an error by the pitcher, putting a man on first and second with one out. Sonoma's Kevin Asselin struck out Will Feil, bringing up Brian McBryde with two outs. He hit a slow roller up the middle and dived for first base but was called out on a bang-bang play by the shortstop, negating the run UCM thought they had scored.

The Seawolves came right back to score in the 19th and the Mules tried for another comeback in the bottom half, but to no avail, as the left Iain Dykins stranded at second after a one-out double.



### The Coaches

Head Coach **Tom Myers** is coaching his first season at Central Missouri after a four-year stay at Kansas State University as the hitting and outfielders coach.

He also coached three seasons at UCM, including the 2003 National Championship and 2001 runner-up. During that time with the Mules, they had an outstanding record of 154-30.

As the head coach, he is 46-16 overall but during his time as a Mule, he has compiled a 200-46 record (.816).

**Matt Jones** is in his 2nd season with Shippensburg and has led them to a 67-49 overall mark there. He has a career record of 215-175-2 and came to SU from Division III Elizabethtown College.

Myers is 0-0 against Shippensburg while Jones is 0-0 against UCM.

### The Series

The Mules have never played the Red Raiders. UCM is 3-1 against teams from the North Atlantic region in the World Series, and 10-1 against teams from the state of Pennsylvania overall, losing only to Slippery Rock (Pa.) back in the 2000 Division II World Series by a 10-9 margin.

### Mules Baseball: Winningest Team of the Millenium

The University of Central Missouri baseball program has had unprecedented success in the last 20 years and has been even more impressive since 2000. UCM has a 463-100 overall record since 2000, the most wins of any program in NCAA Division I, II, or III.

### In the D-II World Series

The Mules have advanced to 15 consecutive NCAA Tournaments and 22 overall. **They have advanced to the Division II World Series on 14 occasions and have a 26-24 mark there.** UCM is 51-18 in regional action, making them 77-42 overall in NCAA competition. They have also advanced to the championships in 11 of the last 15 years. **The Mules are 7-5 in games after a loss at the World Series.**

Central Missouri has finished in the top five in 11 of their trips to the series, including four third place finishes, one runner-up, and two national titles. The Mules have won at least two games there in each of the last five appearances.

**245 schools have NCAA D-II Baseball, 48 make the NCAA Regional Field, and only eight make the D-II World Series.**

### B-Mac: No. 1 All-Time

Central Missouri senior shortstop **Bryan McBryde** has been a four-year starter and became the MIAA and UCM all-time hits leader against Emporia State this year. He passed UCM Hall of Famer Craig Ringe (275) and currently has 308 hits, ranking him eighth in NCAA Division II history. He needs one more to tie Nick Diyorio of Florida Southern for seventh. He got No. 300 against Wayne State and is only one of 12 players in NCAA history to break the 300 barrier.

He also just broke Ringe's mark in career doubles (61) with No. 63 this weekend, before moving up to No. 17 in NCAA history with 222 career runs as well. He also just broke Ringe's career assist mark (583) as well with No. 588 against Sonoma.

He is also fourth on the team with a .371 average and boasts a .945 fielding percentage.

### Marathon Game

The Mules 19 inning contest with Sonoma State broke several records as it was the longest in Division II World Series, MIAA and UCM history. There were three other records broken though. Three players had nine at-bats, including Iain Dykins and Balin Bergman from the Mules, breaking the record of eight.

Mules pitching also tallied 22 K's, snapping the old mark of 20. The final record was the team at-bat record of 58, which was shattered by 68 from the Mules and 73 from the Seawolves.

### Takin' Carey Business

Junior **Mark Carey** has earned every bit of his post-season accolades. He has a 10-1 record and ranks first in the league in wins, strikeouts (96), ERA, and opponents batting average (.218). His ERA of 2.94 ranks first in the MIAA as well as only allowing six hits a game to rank 11th in the nation.

He was named MIAA Pitcher of the Year and NCAA Central Region Pitcher of the Year for his performance this season. He was also named first-team All-MIAA and first-team all-region this season.

### All-Americans

Mules baseball continued its tradition of All-Americans on Tuesday as well as **Mark Carey** was named a second-team Daktronics All-American. Also on the Daktronics honorable mention squad were juniors **Chris Matlock** (relief pitcher) and **Mike Hallam** (DH).

The ABCA All-Americans were also announced on Tuesday and Matlock was named to the second team.

### Matlock Em' Down

Mules closer and Central Region MVP **Chris Matlock** tied former All-American Nick Webber for the UCM record of 11 saves in a season against ESU. He also broke the school mark of 31 appearances in a season by Eric Horner on Saturday night against Franklin Pierce.

He has not allowed a run in his last 24.1 innings with only seven hits, five walks, and a hit by pitch. 76 of last 89 batters he has faced recorded an out.

### Fantastic 40

The Mules made it their 10th consecutive season with at least 43 wins against Nebraska-Omaha on Friday. They also got their 39th win of the year, making it the 15th straight season with that many wins.

The Mules also extended another streak. They have made the NCAA Tournament the last 15 seasons in a row and have made seven D-II World Series berths since 2000.
