How the MIAA champion was determined
1966-70 & 1979-83: Best-of-three series between Northern & Southern Division winners.
1971-78: Best regular season conference record.
1984: Top three teams in each division advanced to six-team double-elimination bracket (one of the teams, UMR, chose not to participate).
1985-93: Top two teams in each division advanced to a four-team, double-elimination bracket.

1994-96 & 1998-2000: Eight teams advanced to postseason, with four teams eliminated through best-of-three series. The series winners played a four-team, double-elimination tournament.
1997: Two four-team double-elimination brackets, with winners playing a best-of-three championship series.
2001-present: Best regular season conference record (Four-team, double-elimination tournament winner is recognized separately).

Over the past 94 years, the MIAA has gained the reputation of being one of the top NCAA Division II conferences in the nation.

MIAA student-athletes have won 13 NCAA team championships and, since 1964, over 165 individual national titles. The MIAA currently conducts championships in seven sports for men and seven for women.

For the men, champions are crowned in football, cross country, basketball, indoor and outdoor track & field, baseball, tennis and golf. The women compete for titles in volleyball, cross country, soccer, basketball, indoor and outdoor track & field, softball and tennis.

The MIAA turned a new page on July 1, 1992, when the NCAA Division II conference changed its name from the Missouri Intercollegiate Athletic Association to the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association.

The decision to make the change originated in 1989, when Pittsburg State University and Washburn University became the first schools outside the state of Missouri to gain membership in the MIAA.

The conference was first organized in 1912 with 14 member institutions. Of those original members, University of Central Missouri, Truman State University, and Northwest Missouri State University are the only original schools still members.

The first change in membership came in 1924, when the MIAA reorganized to include only the five regional Missouri state colleges: Central, Truman (at the time known as Northeast Missouri State), Northwest, Southeast Missouri State University and Southwest Missouri State University. Over the next 56 years, three schools joined the membership: the Missouri School of Mines (now University of Missouri-Rolla) in 1935, Lincoln University in 1970, and the University of Missouri-St. Louis in 1980.

The 1980s brought the biggest changes in the conference. In 1981, Southwest Missouri State University opted to move to NCAA Division I and the MIAA appointed its first full-time commissioner, Ken Jones, in July.

He would be in the position for 16 years, retiring in 1997. Former Gulf South and Metro commissioner Ralph McFillen succeeded Jones and served until 2006. Former Texas A&M-Commerce athletic director and Central Missouri associate athletic director Jim Johnson took over for McFillen in July of 2006.

Southwest Baptist University brought membership back to eight schools in 1986, before the major expansion of the conference in 1989. Pittsburg State, Washburn, Missouri Southern State College (now University) and Missouri Western State College – formerly members of the Central States Intercollegiate Conference – began competition in the 1989-90 season.

Southeast Missouri State left the MIAA following the 1990-91 season to move on to NCAA Division I, and was replaced by Emporia State University in the 1991-92 season.

In August 1991, Judy Willson was hired as the MIAA's first full-time sports information director. She left in 1994, and was succeeded by Matt Newbery, formerly the assistant sports information director at Pittsburg State. He became assistant commissioner for media relations in 2005.

A third full-time staff member was added in 2005, as former Emporia State track athlete Natasha Oakes was hired as assistant commissioner for compliance. A fourth member was added in 2007 as Larry House became the Coordinator of External Affairs.

The membership of the MIAA is now at 11 schools with the addition of Fort Hays (Kan.) State University in 2006 and the University of Nebraska-Omaha in 2008.

MIAA Historical Timeline

- 1912:** Original MIAA formed - Cape Girardeau State Teachers, Kirksville State Teachers, Maryville State Teachers, Springfield State Teachers, Warrensburg State Teachers, Central College, Central Wesleyan, Culver-Stockton, Drury, Missouri Valley, Missouri Wesleyan, Tarkio, Westminster, and William Jewell.
- 1924:** The MIAA reorganized to include only the five regional state colleges - Central, Northwest, Northeast, Southwest and Southeast. Sports include Football basketball and outdoor track and field.
- 1931:** Tennis added as a conference sport.
- 1932:** Indoor track added as an MIAA sport.
- 1934:** Golf added as a conference sport.
- 1935:** Missouri School of Mines (now Missouri-Rolla) joins the MIAA.
- 1957:** MIAA joins the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) College Division.
- 1958:** Cross Country added as an MIAA sport.
- 1970:** Lincoln University joins the MIAA.
- 1980:** University of Missouri-St. Louis joins the MIAA.
- 1981:** Soccer added as a conference sport. Ken B. Jones is appointed as MIAA's first full-time commissioner. Southwest Missouri State leaves for NCAA Division I.
- 1982:** The MIAA begins sponsoring championships in women's athletics.
- 1988:** Southwest Baptist University joins the MIAA.
- 1989:** Missouri Southern State, Missouri Western State, Pittsburg State and Washburn join MIAA. Soccer championship suspended.
- 1991:** Southeast Missouri State leaves the MIAA for NCAA Division I, Emporia State joins the MIAA.
- 1992:** Name changed to Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association.
- 1994:** Soccer championship play resumes.
- 1996:** Missouri-St. Louis completes final season before moving to the Great Lakes Valley Conference. Northeast Missouri State changes name to Truman State University.
- 1997:** Ralph McFillen appointed MIAA's second full-time commissioner.
- 1999:** Women's Soccer championship play begins; Men's soccer dropped as a conference sport. Lincoln University leaves to be an Independent.
- 2005:** University of Missouri-Rolla leaves the MIAA for the Great Lakes Valley Conference. Missouri Western granted university status, becoming Missouri Western State University.
- 2006:** Fort Hays State University joins the MIAA Jim Johnson appointed MIAA's third full-time commissioner.
- 2008:** Nebraska-Omaha joins the MIAA. Southwest Baptist drops out in football.
