Mules jump on Miners and coast, 50-13

(Warrensburg, Mo.) – The No. 19 Central Missouri Mules scored the game's first 27 points and rolled to a 50-13 win over Missouri S&T on Thursday night at Walton Stadium/Kennedy Field.

MIAA Player of the Week Eric Czerniewski was the star again as he completed his first eight passes and finished the game with a 19-of-22 line. That went with 279 yards and four touchdowns through the air.

Junior wide receiver Jamorris Warren took a screen pass 27 yards to pay-dirt to cap off the first possession of the game for the Mules (2-0).

UCM would score on 8-of-11 possessions, with two of those ending on kneeldowns at halftime and the end of the game. UCM's only full possession that didn't end in a score was stopped on downs on the S&T 35. The Mules didn't even attempt a punt in the contest.

Junior running back Anthony Stewart had the second score with 9:20 left in the first quarter on an 11-yard scamper, before Warren caught his second pass of the season for another TD from five yards out with 16 seconds left in the period.

Junior running back Zain Gower got in on the fun in the second quarter with a two yard run in his first game of the season. Missouri S&T (0-1) answered that drive with its first score of the season on an 18-yard pitch-and-catch from Jason Schlueter to Bryan Crider.

The Mules grabbed their final score of the half on a 31-yard strike to junior Seth Mason. The touchdown capped a 60-yard drive that took only 1:24 off the clock, giving UCM a 33-6 lead with 2:47 left in the half.

The Mules took that lead into the break, racking up 305 yards of offense in the half. The defense bended, but did not break, allowing 195 yards. The Mules also got their first interception of the year in the period thanks to junior corner Joseph Bangali. He picked off a Schlueter pass on the UCM four-yard line and returned it 20 yards in the second quarter.

Czerniewski played only the first series of the final half, leading the Mules 88 yards in 10 plays, capped by a 10-yard TD pass to Stewart to make it 40-6.

Sophomore backup Tommy Corwin led the Mules next three possessions, before junior Geno Waters came in for the final drive. Corwin took the Mules down field, thanks to a heaving running attack, before Gower punched in his second score of the day from two yards out with 11:31 left in the final quarter.

Freshman kicker Aaron Jamieson got his first career field goal on the next possession from 28 yards out to make it 50-6 with 8:14 left.

S&T got another score on a fourth-and-14 play at the UCM 18 to cap the scoring with 4:26 left. The Mules drove it down to the Miners four yard line on the next possession before taking a knee to end the contest.

Central Missouri totaled up 218 yards rushing and 364 yards through the air on the night (582 total). The Miners managed only 338 yards in the game thanks to a stingy Mules defense.

Junior tight end DeMarco Cosby led the Mules receivers with 114 yards on six grabs, while the three-headed running attack of Stewart, Hubbard, and Gower had 58, 57, and 47 yards respectively. Defensively, junior linebacker Cody Scribner had a team-high eight tackles, while junior bandit backer Karl Parker logged seven stops.

Last Time They Met - October 4, 2008

(WARRENSBURG, Mo.) – The 22nd ranked Central Missouri Mules bounced back from their first loss last week with a 42-14 trouncing of Emporia State at Walton Stadium/Kennedy Field on Saturday. Junior quarterback Eric Czerniewski threw for a career-high four touchdown passes in the outing.

Central Missouri (5-1, 3-1 MIAA) scored the game's first 42 points before the Hornets (3-3, 1-3 MIAA) added a couple cosmetic scores in the fourth quarter. What was more impressive is that the Mules did it without seven starters, four of which were All-MIAA players.

The Mules started slow, but quickly heated up after punts on their first two drives of the day. Czerniewski hit senior running back Glenn Milner on a screen pass that he turned into a 56 yard touchdown, weaving through traffic and cutting across the field with 4:48 left in the first quarter.

The Mules got a big play from special teams on the ensuing ESU possession when freshman defensive back Brett Ginn blocked a punt and junior defensive end Marc Tiernan picked it up and ran it in from 10 yards out for the score.

After a lost fumble by each team, the Hornets drove 81 yards down to the Mule 14 yard line and missed a 32 yard field goal attempt. Central Missouri went 80 yards in only two plays to take advantage with a 31-yard reverse by senior wide receiver Edgar Givens, followed by a 49-yard touchdown pass to Milner down the left sideline to make it 21-0.

The Mules lighting quick attack continued on the next drive when Czerniewski hit sophomore tight end DeMarco Cosby for a 55-yard score. That made it 28-0 with seven minutes remaining in the half.

Emporia State starting quarterback Andre Sloan El did not play, and backup Zach Rampy was ineffective, getting benched with 10 minutes remaining in the half. ESU brought in mobile third-stringer Sheldon Smith for him and the Hornets finished the day with 48 rushing attempts compared to only 14 passes.

The Mules had a 268-to-142 total yard advantage in the first half as the Mules held ESU to 1-of-8 on third down.

Central Missouri's defense stopped Emporia State on fourth down, thanks to a fake punt attempt in the third quarter to set up the next score. UCM went 24 yards in four plays, capped by a three-yard run from Czerniewski, his first of the year.

The Mules made it 42-0 on their next drive, setting it up with a 54-yard pass to Cosby down to the ESU two yard line. Czerniewski hooked up with sophomore fullback Brent Boehringer from there, for his second TD reception of the year with 14:20 left in the game. Backup quarterback Tommy Corwin finished the game from there.

Cosby and Milner each logged their first career 100-yard receiving games

with 121 and 114 yards, respectively. Czerniewski went 14-of-19 for 283 yards, and the Mule rushing attack finished with 123 yards on 25 carries. Overall, the offense piled up 432 yards.

The Mules defense held ESU to only 288 yards of offense and got in the backfield all day, piling up 5.0 sacks, 13 tackles for loss, and three QB hurries. Junior strong safety Mike Stevenson and senior linebacker Max Fairclough led the defense with eight stops apiece while senior defensive end John Wood had seven stops, a half sack, and 1.5 tackles for loss.

The Series & Coaches

This is the 57th meeting between the Mules and the Hornets with UCM taking the last nine meetings and holding a 35-17-4 overall advantage. ESU has not defeated the Mules since 1999. The Mules are 4-2 in Emporia under Fritz, winning the last four (losses came in 1997, 1999).

Fritz is 9-3 against Emporia State and has won his last nine. This will be Higgins' third meeting with UCM, going 0-2.

Willie Fritz is in his 13th season as head coach at the University of Central Missouri. He is 91-44 as the Mules' mentor, 67-41 vs. MIAA opponents. His .674 winning percentage is fourth best in UCM football history, while **his 90 career wins rank No. 1 in school history.**

A 1983 graduate of Pittsburg State University, he is now tied for sixth in the MIAA in career wins, third among active MIAA coaches.

Garin Higgins is in his third season at Emporia State as a head coach (8-16 overall, 3-15 MIAA), but he played there and graduated in 1992. He has a 59-25 record as a head coach, going 51-9 at NAIA power Northwest Oklahoma. He came to ESU after serving offensive coordinator stints at Minnesota State and Northeastern State (Okla.) the previous two years.

Scouting the Hornets

Emporia State will open MIAA play after a 1-1 start to the non-conference schedule. They defeated Southwestern Oklahoma at home, 48-17, before falling to Augustana by a 32-21 margin on the road.

The Hornets running game boasts tailbacks LaDarrian Page and Adrian Abner. Page played his freshman season at Missouri Western, earning All-MIAA honors. He has rushed for 249 yards and four touchdowns so far this season. The passing attack has seen three quarterbacks in the action, led by Andre Sloan El. He has thrwn for 189 yards with a TD and two INT's. As a team they average 383 yards and 34.5 points per contest.

The Hornets defense is the strong spot, holding the opposition to 260 yards and 24.5 points per game. They are led by linebackers Katrell Larkins and Blake Ringwall, both of which have 14 stops on the season. ESU allows 111 rushing and 179 passing yards per game.

Running Game = Success

The Mules are 52-5 since the 2001 season when they have outgained their opponents on the ground versus a 12-21 mark when they have been outrushed by their opponents. Last week the Mules out-gained Missouri S&T by a 218-to-69 margin.

Fritz Special Forces

Mules coach Willie Fritz is known for his attention to special teams. During his tenure, the Mules have **returned 21 punts for touchdowns and eight kickoffs to pay dirt.** And even more impressive, his teams have **blocked 35 punts** during his tenure (including four last year). The school record for blocks in a season is six (set twice, both in Fritz' reign, 2003 and 1999).

Turnover Ratio

The Mules are 42-8 since 2001 when they have won the turnover battle compared to 12-12 when they have committed more turnovers. They are also 9-7 when both teams are tied in turnovers. Following is the break down for positive/negative

In MIAA Openers

The Mules are 8-4 in MIAA openers in the Willie Fritz era, winning against Truman the last two seasons. The Mules are 67-41 in MIAA play during the Willie Fritz era after going 5-4 a year ago. Their best MIAA record came in 2002 when they posted an 8-1 mark, losing only to Northwest Missouri.

Undefeated Starts

Central Missouri has started 2-0 on 11 occasions under head coach Willie Fritz out of 13 seasons. The Mules have started 3-0 seven times, including last year's 4-0 start.

Their best start came in 2002 when they came out of the gates at 8-0.

In the Polls

They Mules were ranked in the AFCA Preseason top 25 for the first time since 2004, when they were 10th. They came into 2009 ranked 25th, but have moved to 19th, and this week, 13th.

The No. 13 national ranking is the highest for Mules football since September 7, 2004, when it was No. 8. The highest ranking in UCM history was No. 6 back in October of 2002. UCM has now been ranked in 59 polls since the AFCA started the coaches poll in 2000.

This Week in Mules Football

The MIAA Preseason Coaches Poll (pg. 6), as well as the inaugural MIAA Media Poll, ranked the Mules third overall in the conference.

Cosby Out of the Gates

Junior tight end **DeMarco Cosby** is the Mules only returning All-American and was honored with preseason first-team All-American honors by Consensus Draft Services this season. He is the first preseason All-American since Kendall Ricketts, and the first on offense since Kegan Coleman in 2004.

He got 2009 started with a bang, tying a school record with two touchdown catches by a tight end against SBU. He recorded a team-high seven catches, and had 77 yards receiving. He followed with with 114 yards receiving against Missouri S&T last week.

Super Czerniewski

Mules junior quarterback **Eric Czerniewski** keeps moving up the charts after his passing performance last week. He holds the school record for passing yards (2,938) and total offense (3,010) in a season, as well as touchdowns responsible for (33). He has also had five 300-yard passing games to break that mark.

He leads the MIAA in total offense (317 ypg) and passing yards (316.5 ypg) so far this season. He broke the career record with his sixth 300-yard of total offense game, and his 29 completions vs. SBU were the second-best in school history.

He is also in the career top 10 in every statistical passing category:
3. Most TD Passes50, needs 2 to tie Toby Korrodi in 2nd
4. Most Pass Attempts701, needs 190 to tie Jeff Phillips in 3rd
4. Most Pass Comp.414, needs 82 to tie Jeff Phillips in 3rd

Balanced Stable

The Mules are sporting a full crew of running backs this season, and balance is the key as they combined for 218 yards rushing against Missouri S&T.

Junior **Anthony Stewart** had 58 yards and two TD's (one receiving), junior **Zain Gower** had 47 yards and two TD's, and junior **Tywon Hubbard** tallied 57 yards.

Thats Offensive

The Mules are averaging an MIAA leading 359 yards passing per game, as well as a league-high 527 yards of total offense per contest. Central Missouri has also racked up 44.5 points per game to rank second among conference teams.

The Mules also broke a school record for first downs in a game against the Miners with 34. The previous record came against Pittsburg State in 2005 on the famous 83-21 victory. Their 582 yards of offense against Missouri S&T was the first time UCM has had more than 500 yards in a game since 2007.

Central Missouri has not been shut out since September 21, 1991 against Missouri Southern. The 192 game streak is the third longest in the nation, and an MIAA record.

Defense Steps Up

The Mules defense had a major improvement from game one to game two, allowing only 13 points and 338 yards of offense. UCM held the Miners to only 69 yards rushing, and allowed only two plays of more than 20 yards in the game. Against SBU, the Bearcats had nine plays of 20 yards or more, adding up to 320 yards of offense on those snaps alone.

Bringin' it Back

Senior kick returner **Bobby Guillory** started the season where he left off in 2008, returning four kicks for 124 yards, including a long of 40 yards against Southwest Baptist.

He currently has 777 yards of kick returns in his career to rank eighth all-time. He needs 188 yards to catch Delanie Walker (965).

His 653 yards last season ranks fourth all-time, while his 188 yards against Missouri Western is a school record.

Junior **Zain Gower** returned the opening kickoff 43 yards against MST, while junior **Adam Parks** returned a punt 25 yards in the same contest.

Closing Time

A major emphasis for the Mules in 2009 is closing out games. They got a good start on that goal against Southwest Baptist, scoring the game's final 19 points, including a 13-0 shutout in the final quarter. Against MST, UCM scored 10 points in the fourth, before allowing a late touchdown when it was up 50-6.

Penalized

The Mules committed 13 penalties for 109 yards against Southwest Baptist. It was the highest number of penalties since 2002, when they committed 16 against Truman. The 109 yards was the most since 2005, when UCM had 131 against Missouri Southern.

The Mules completely reversed their game one miscues by committing only 1 penalty against MST for 10 yards. It was the fewest in a contest since 2006 against Missouri Western.

Mules in the Pros:

There is one Mule on an NFL roster coming into the 2009 season and he is playing for the San Francisco 49ers. Tight end/H-back **Delanie Walker (2004-05)** signed a three-year, \$6 million contract with a \$1.8 million signing bonus in 2008, and had 10 grabs for 155 yards and a touchdown during the year.

(Warrensburg, Mo.) – The No. 25 Central Missouri Mules tallied the game's final three touchdowns to come back from an eight point deficit and grab a 39-28 season-opening win on Thursday night against the Bearcats of Southwest Baptist.

The Mules (1-0) made it 18 wins in a row over the Bearcats (0-1), extending a streak that has been alive since a 1991 loss.

The Central Missouri offense was paced by junior quarterback Eric Czerniewski, who accounted for five of the Mules six touchdowns (4 passing, 1 rushing). He threw for 354 yards, his third best effort ever, and went 29-of-41 for the second most single-game completions in school history.

The contest started off with a bang as junior running back Anthony Stewart caught a screen pass and took it 70 yards for a score on the Mules first play of their first possession. A missed extra point made it only a 6-0 lead.

UCM made it 13-0 on its next possession, thanks to a 9-play, 60-yard drive. Czerniewski converted a fourth-and-eight with a 25-yard touchdown strike to junior All-American tight end DeMarco Cosby.

The Bearcats answered late in the first quarter with a 51-yard rush by Thaddeus Everson, and then took the lead in the second on a 30-yard rush by Justin Duhaney, 14-13.

Central Missouri came back on the next drive after a 37-yard kick return by senior Bobby Guillory. The Mules went 56 yards in nine plays, capped by a one-yard TD plunge from Czerniewski but the Bearcats had the last strike before the break.

A 56-yard completion from Steve Gachette to Johnnie King with 1:01 left was the difference, making it 21-20 at halftime.

Central Missouri committed eight penalties in the opening half, while SBU had five. Both offenses were potent, with

nearly 300 yards apiece as well.

The Bearcats got some luck to start the second half, scoring on a 35-yard touchdown pass that bounced off an SBU receiver and fell into tight end Jameson Manuma's hands for an easy coast into the end zone, making it 28-20 with 7:05 left in the third. That would be the last score for the Bearcats though, as the Mule defense put the clamps down.

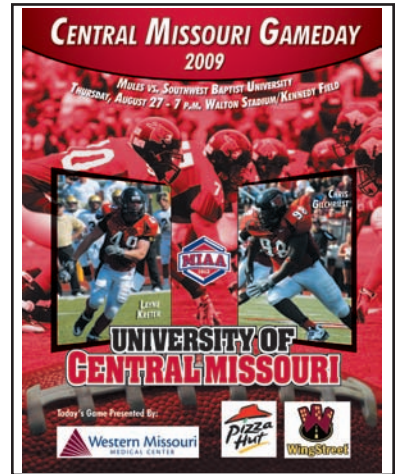
The Mules finished the game with four sacks, six quarterback hurries, and nine tackles for loss, but the biggest play came after the Mules got a 30-yard touchdown reception from junior running back Tywon Hubbard to make it 28-26 (failed two-point conversion). Freshman defensive back Brett Ginn forced a fumble and recovered it on the SBU 35.

The Mules punched it in on a 5-yard hookup to Cosby early in the fourth quarter to give the Mules a lead for good, 32-28. The score tied a school record for TD's in a game by a tight end with two.

The game-killer came later in the quarter though. SBU was stuffed on a fake punt back at their own 39, and they Mules then took six minutes off the clock before stuffing it in the endzone on 1-yard rush from Stewart with 2:14 left.

Stewart finished the game with team highs in receiving (104 yards) and rushing (70 yards), while Cosby had seven grabs for 77 yards. As a team the offense finished with 473 total yards (354 passing, 119 rushing).

Defensively the Mules were led by junior linebacker Cody Scribner with 10 tackles, while senior defensive end Marc Tiernan had 1.5 sacks and seven tackles. Ginn also had a half sack to go with his fumble recovery. UCM gave up 489 yards of offense in the game, but only 200 in the second half, 60 of which came on the final drive of the game.

Mules 50, Missouri S&T 13

(Warrensburg, Mo.) – The No. 19 Central Missouri Mules scored the game's first 27 points and rolled to a 50-13 win over Missouri S&T on Thursday night at Walton Stadium/Kennedy Field.

MIAA Player of the Week Eric Czerniewski was the star again as he completed his first eight passes and finished the game with a 19-of-22 line. That went with 279 yards and four touchdowns though the air.

Junior wide receiver Jamorris Warren took a screen pass 27 yards to pay-dirt to cap off the first possession of the game for the Mules (2-0).

UCM would score on 8-of-11 possessions, with two of those ending on kneel-downs at halftime and the end of the game. UCM's only full possession that didn't end in a score was stopped on downs on the S&T 35. The Mules didn't even attempt a punt in the contest.

Junior running back Anthony Stewart had the second score with 9:20 left in the first quarter on an 11-yard scamper, before Warren caught his second pass of the season for another TD from five yards out with 16 seconds left in the period.

Junior running back Zain Gower got in on the fun in the second quarter with a two yard run in his first game of the season. Missouri S&T (0-1) answered that drive with its first score of the season on an 18-yard pitch-and-catch from Jason Schlueter to Bryan Crider.

The Mules grabbed their final score of the half on a 31-yard strike to junior Seth Mason. The touchdown capped a 60-yard drive that took only 1:24 off the clock, giving UCM a 33-6 lead with 2:47 left in the half.

The Mules took that lead into the break, racking up 305 yards of offense in the half. The defense bended, but did not break, allowing 195 yards. The Mules also got their first interception of the year in the period thanks to junior corner Joseph Bangali. He picked off a Schlueter pass on the UCM four-yard line and returned it 20 yards in the second quarter.

Czerniewski played only the first series of the final half, leading the Mules 88 yards in 10 plays, capped by a 10-yard TD pass to Stewart to make it 40-6.

Sophomore backup Tommy Corwin led the Mules next three possessions, before junior Geno Waters came in for the final drive. Corwin took the Mules down field, thanks to a heaving running attack, before Gower punched in his second score of the day from two yards out with 11:31 left in the final quarter.

Freshman kicker Aaron Jamieson got his first career field goal on the next possession from 28 yards out to make it 50-6 with 8:14 left.

S&T got another score on a fourth-and-14 play at the UCM 18 to cap the scoring with 4:26 left. The Mules drove it down to the Miners four yard line on the next possession before taking a knee to end the contest.

Central Missouri totaled up 218 yards rushing and 364 yards through the air on the night (582 total). The Miners managed only 338 yards in the game thanks to a stingy Mules defense.

Junior tight end DeMarco Cosby led the Mules receivers with 114 yards on six grabs, while the three-headed running attack of Stewart, Hubbard, and Gower had 58, 57, and 47 yards respectively.

Defensively, junior linebacker Cody Scribner had a team-high eight tackles, while junior bandit backer Karl Parker logged seven stops.
