Mules outlast Bearcats to win opener, 39-28

(Warrensburg, Mo.) – The No. 25 Central Missouri Mules tallied the game's final three touchdowns to come back from an eight point deficit and grab a 39-28 season-opening win on Thursday night against the Bearcats of Southwest Baptist.

The Mules (1-0) made it 18 wins in a row over the Bearcats (0-1), extending a streak that has been alive since a 1991 loss.

The Central Missouri offense was paced by junior quarterback Eric Czerniewski, who accounted for five of the Mules six touchdowns (4 passing, 1 rushing). He threw for 354 yards, his third best effort ever, and went 29-of-41 for the second most single-game completions in school history.

The contest started off with a bang as junior running back Anthony Stewart caught a screen pass and took it 70 yards for a score on the Mules first play of their first possession. A missed extra point made it only a 6-0 lead.

UCM made it 13-0 on its next possession, thanks to a 9-play, 60-yard drive. Czerniewski converted a fourth-and-eight with a 25-yard touchdown strike to junior All-American tight end DeMarco Cosby.

The Bearcats answered late in the first quarter with a 51-yard rush by Thaddeus Everson, and then took the lead in the second on a 30-yard rush by Justin Duhaney, 14-13.

Central Missouri came back on the next drive after a 37-yard kick return by senior Bobby Guillory. The Mules went 56 yards in nine plays, capped by a one-yard TD plunge from Czerniewski but the Bearcats had the last strike before the break.

A 56-yard completion from Steve Gachette to Johnnie King with 1:01 left was the difference, making it 21-20 at halftime.

Central Missouri committed eight penalties in the opening half, while SBU had five. Both offenses were potent, with nearly 300 yards apiece as well.

The Bearcats got some luck to start the second half, scoring on a 35-yard

touchdown pass that bounced off an SBU receiver and fell into tight end Jameson Manuma's hands for an easy coast into the end zone, making it 28-20 with 7:05 left in the third. That would be the last score for the Bearcats though, as the Mule defense put the clamps down.

The Mules finished the game with four sacks, six quarterback hurries, and nine tackles for loss, but the biggest play came after the Mules got a 30-yard touchdown reception from junior running back Tywon Hubbard to make it 28-26 (failed two-point conversion). Freshman defensive back Brett Ginn forced a fumble and recovered it on the SBU 35.

The Mules punched it in on a 5-yard hookup to Cosby early in the fourth quarter to give the Mules a lead for good, 32-28. The score tied a school record for TD's in a game by a tight end with two.

The game-killer came later in the quarter though. SBU was stuffed on a fake punt back at their own 39, and they Mules then took six minutes off the clock before stuffing it in the endzone on 1-yard rush from Stewart with 2:14 left.

Stewart finished the game with team highs in receiving (104 yards) and rushing (70 yards), while Cosby had seven grabs for 77 yards. As a team the offense finished with 473 total yards (354 passing, 119 rushing).

Defensively the Mules were led by junior linebacker Cody Scribner with 10 tackles, while senior defensive end Marc Tiernan had 1.5 sacks and seven tackles. Ginn also had a half sack to go with his fumble recovery. UCM gave up 489 yards of offense in the game, but only 200 in the second half, 60 of which came on the final drive of the game.

Last Time They Met - October 11, 2004

(ROLLA, Mo.) – It had to happen sooner or later, but for Central Missouri faithful, later would have been much better. As it was, the University of Missouri-Rolla ended its 58-game MIAA losing streak by shocking the Mules 42-38 Saturday (October 11) in Rolla.

The loss overshadowed a record-setting performance by senior tailback Kegan Coleman. With 202 yards rushing on 36 carries, Coleman became the Mules' all-time leading rusher. He now has 3,520 yards, surpassing the 3,323 yards gained by Elliott Eley from 1985-88.

With 1:35 left to play and trailing 38-35, UMR set up at its own 20-yard line. Nine plays later, Brandon Landry hit Phil Shin on a 34-yard touchdown aerial to put the Miners up 42-38.

Central Missouri got the ball back in great field position on its 35-yard line after the Miners' kicked off out of bounds. But on fourth and eight from the UCM 47, quarterback Jimmy Sangster was flushed from the pocket and was stopped a yard short of the first down. From there, UMR took a knee and had its first conference win since 1997.

In the early going, it looked like just another Miner loss, as UCM jumped out to a 14-0 lead with 6:40 remaining in the first quarter. Sangster hit Delanie Walker on a 26-yard post route for the Mules' first score, and then Kegan Coleman plunged in from a yard out for the early lead.

Rolla came back, though, at the 2:01 mark and scored on a 24-yard strike from Landry to Ashton Gronewald. The two teams traded scores the rest of the first half.

UCM got another Coleman touchdown on an eight-yard jaunt with 12:04 remaining in the half. The Miners then marched 81 yards on 10 plays with Landry capping the drive on a 17-yard run.

Sangster matched his counterpart by scoring on a five-yard run with 2:00 left before intermission to give the Mules a 28-14 lead. But then UMR went 65 yards on 11 plays with Landry hitting All-America tight end Cole Drussa from 10 yards out to pull within 28-21 with eight ticks on the clock.

On their first possession of the second half, the Mules were driving and looked ready to go up by two TDs. But on second-and-one from the Miner 13, Sangster threw behind his receiver, and right into the waiting arms of UMR's Jeremy Dotson. Dotson raced 49 yards to the UCM 35, where the Miners set up shop. They tied it at 28-28 at the 9:45 mark of the third quarter as Mark Becker came in for an injured Landry and on his first play hit Drussa on a three-yard strike.

The Mules responded this time, going 80 yards and taking 5:33 off the

clock. Lee Thompson capped the drive by diving in from the one.

After a UMR fumble, the Mules went back to work and again appeared ready to go up by two scores when their drive stalled at the Miners' 29-yard line. Brandon Starks, a perfect 10-for-10 on the year, lined up for the 46-yard field goal attempt. His effort, though was short, and the score remained 35-28.

From there the Miners needed just five plays to go 71 yards, Landry again finding Gronewald for the six-yard touchdown pass and a 35-35 score.

UCM got to the Miners 28 two possessions later, and this time Starks punched through a 45-yard field goal for the 38-35 lead. That, though, was not going to be enough, as the Miners would not go quietly into the night.

For the game, the Mules out-gained UMR 510-to-490. UCM mustered a season-high 328 yards rushing and completed 12-of-18 passes for 182 yards. But the Miners went to the air for 335 yards and added 155 yards on the ground. Missouri-Rolla also converted three times on fourth down.

Thompson rushed for 89 yards on 18 carries, while Walker and Jimmy Conner were the primary targets through the air. Walker had four receptions for 66 yards, while Conner added four grabs for 73 yards.

The Series & Coaches

This is the 75th meeting between Missouri S&T and Central Missouri. The Mules have won 17 of the last 19 meetings, losing only in 2004 and 1991. The Mules have scored at least 27 points in the last eight games of the series, but they have not met since 2004, the Miners last year in the MIAA. UCM leads the series overall 36-35-3.

Fritz is 7-1 against the Miners while Kirby Cannon is 1-5 against UCM.

Willie Fritz is in his 13th season as head coach at the University of Central Missouri. He is 90-44 as the Mules' mentor, 67-41 vs. MIAA opponents. His .672 winning percentage is fourth best in UCM football history, while **his 90 career wins rank No. 1 in school history.**

A 1983 graduate of Pittsburg State University, he is now tied for sixth in the MIAA in career wins, third among active MIAA coaches.

Kirby Cannon is in his 11th season at Missouri S&T, and comes in off a GLVC title and a 7-4 record last year. He has a 31-79 career mark.

Scouting the Miners

A former member of the MIAA, Missouri S&T comes into Thursday's contest after a Great Lakes Valley Conference championship. The Miners will open their season with the Mules, taking college football week one off.

Individually, the offense returns some leading skill position players, including one of the quarterbacks in senior Jason Schlueter. He tossed for 1,848 yards and 17 TD's with a 68.5 completion percentage. His leading receiver Chad Shockley also returns. He had 724 yards and seven scores on 56 catches, all team highs. At tailback, the Miners return two guys that saw significant time in Jerome Miller and Mike Wilson. As a team the Miners averaged 450 yards per game and 37 points per contest.

The Miners defense allowed 368 yards and 25 points per outing last year, and they return five starters. Senior linebacker Steve Edwards is the leading returning tackler at 66, but sophomore corner Terry Robinson also returns, and had 57 stops in 2008. Safety Brian Jordan also returns to the defense and made 51 tackles and two interceptions.

Running Game = Success

The Mules are 51-5 since the 2001 season when they have outgained their opponents on the ground versus a 12-21 mark when they have been outrushed by their opponents.

Fritz Special Forces

Mules coach Willie Fritz is known for his attention to special teams. During his tenure, the Mules have **returned 21 punts for touchdowns and eight kickoffs to pay dirt**. And even more impressive, his teams have **blocked 35 punts** during his tenure (including four last year). The school record for blocks in a season is six (set twice, both in Fritz' reign, 2003 and 1999).

Turnover Ratio

The Mules are 41-8 since 2001 when they have won the turnover battle compared to 13-11 when they have committed more turnovers. They are also 9-7 when both teams are tied in turnovers. Following is the break down for positive/negative

Fritz at Walton Stadium/Kennedy Field

The Mules opened the home portion of the schedule with a win for the 17th consecutive season overall, and 13th in a row under coach Fritz with the win over SBU on Thursday.

The Mules have had great success at home during Fritz 13 seasons, boasting a 52-19 overall mark.

Thursday Night Lights

This is the fifth consecutive season that the Mules have played a Thursday night game. They are 6-1 overall in Thursday games the last five seasons, and 6-0 at home.

Outside the Conference

UCM has been nearly unbeatable in non-conference regular season games under head coach Willie Fritz. They are 23-2 overall and have won 23 of their last 24. Last year the Mules went 2-0, defeating Minnesota State 29-9 and Arkansas Tech 49-13.

In the Polls

They Mules were ranked in the AFCA Preseason top 25 for the first time since 2004, when they were 10th. They came into 2009 ranked 25th but moved up to 19th after the win against Southwest Baptist.

The Mules have been ranked in the second poll of the D2Football.com rankings on several occasions, but not since 2004 have they been in the preseason poll.

The MIAA Preseason Coaches Poll (pg. 6), as well as the inaugural MIAA Media Poll, ranked the Mules third overall in the conference.

This Week in Mules Football

Cosby Out of the Gates

Junior tight end **DeMarco Cosby** is the Mules only returning All-American and was honored with preseason first-team All-American honors by Consensus Draft Services this season. He is the first preseason All-American since Kendall Ricketts, and the first on offense since Kegan Coleman in 2004.

He got 2009 started with a bang, tying a school record with two touchdown catches by a tight end against SBU. He recorded a team-high seven catches, and had 77 yards receiving.

Super Czerniewski

Mules junior quarterback **Eric Czerniewski** keeps moving up the charts after his passing performance last week. He holds the school record for passing yards (2,938) and total offense (3,010) in a season, as well as touchdowns responsible for (33). He has also had five 300-yard passing games to break that mark.

He tossed for 354 yards and four TD's (also one rushing) against SBU to earn **MIAA Offensive Player of the Week** honors. He broke the career record with his sixth 300-yard of total offense game, and his 29 completions were the second-best in school history.

He is also in the career top 10 in every statistical passing category:

Full Stable

The Mules are sporting a full crew of five upper classmen running backs this season, four of which are juniors.

Junior **Anthony Stewart**, junior **Zain Gower**, senior **Justin Gore**, and junior transfers **Tywon Hubbard** (Butler County C.C.), and **Ken Hedrington** (Fresno City College).

Thats Offensive

The Mules averaged 34.5 points per game and led the MIAA with 277.8 yards passing per game in 2008. They also racked up more than 400 yards of offense per contest to rank fourth overall. UCM also broke several school records, including the fewest turnovers in a season at 14.

The Mules kicked off 2009 with another solid effort, going for 473 yards of total offense, including 354 passing and 119 yards rushing. They also tallied 39 points on six TD's.

Central Missouri has not been shut out since September 21, 1991 against Missouri Southern. The 192 game streak is the third longest in the nation, and an MIAA record.

All About the Team

The Mules football team has given away individual game awards in year's past, but in the offseason they decided to make a change. For the first time in the Willie Fritz era, there will be no individual awards. All the goals each week are team oriented, after all, there is no 'I' in team.

Giving up the Big One

UCM will look to improve on last week's performance defensively, namely the big play. All four touchdowns allowed came from at least 30 yards out, including a long of 56 yards.

Central Missouri gave up a total of nine plays over 20 yards long in the game. The total yards of just those nine plays: 320 yards.

Debut Performances

The Mules got some big performances from some of the players in their first game in the Cardinal & Black. Perhaps the biggest one came from junior running back Anthony Stewart. He tallied 175 all-purpose yards (70 rushing, 105 receiving) and two touchdowns.

On defense, the Mules had a big contest from junior defensive lienman P.J. South. He had 1.5 sacks, two tackles for loss, and two quarterback hurries to go with his three tackles.

Under Pressure

Central Missouri got plenty of pressure on the opposing QB last week, logging five sacks and six hurries. They also broke up six passes and made 10 tackles for loss of yards.

Bringin' it Back

Senior kick returner **Bobby Guillory** started the season where he left off in 2008, returning four kicks for 124 yards, including a long of 40 yards against Southwest Baptist.

He currently has 777 yards of kick returns in his career to rank eighth all-time. He needs 188 yards to catch Delanie Walker (965).

His 653 yards last season ranks fourth all-time, while his 188 yards against Missouri Western is a school record.

Closing Time

A major emphasis for the Mules in 2009 is closing out games. They got a good start on that goal against Southwest Baptist, scoring the game's final 19 points, including a 13-0 shutout in the final quarter.

Penalized

The Mules committed 13 penalties for 109 yards against Southwest Baptist last week. It was the highest number of penalties since 2002, when they committed 16 against Truman. The 109 yards was the most since 2005, when UCM had 131 against Missouri Southern.

Mules in the Pros:

There is one Mule on an NFL roster coming into the 2009 season and he is playing for the San Francisco 49ers. Tight end/H-back **Delanie Walker (2004-05)** signed a three-year, \$6 million contract with a \$1.8 million signing bonus in 2008, and had 10 grabs for 155 yards and a touchdown during the year.

Mules 39, Southwest Baptist 28

(Warrensburg, Mo.) – The No. 25 Central Missouri Mules tallied the game's final three touchdowns to come back from an eight point deficit and grab a 39-28 season-opening win on Thursday night against the Bearcats of Southwest Baptist.

The Mules (1-0) made it 18 wins in a row over the Bearcats (0-1), extending a streak that has been alive since a 1991 loss.

The Central Missouri offense was paced by junior quarterback Eric Czerniewski, who accounted for five of the Mules six touchdowns (4 passing, 1 rushing). He threw for 354 yards, his third best effort ever, and went 29-of-41 for the second most single-game completions in school history.

The contest started off with a bang as junior running back Anthony Stewart caught a screen pass and took it 70 yards for a score on the Mules first play of their first possession. A missed extra point made it only a 6-0 lead.

UCM made it 13-0 on its next possession, thanks to a 9-play, 60-yard drive. Czerniewski converted a fourth-and-eight with a 25-yard touchdown strike to junior All-American tight end DeMarco Cosby.

The Bearcats answered late in the first quarter with a 51-yard rush by Thaddeus Everson, and then took the lead in the second on a 30-yard rush by Justin Duhaney, 14-13.

Central Missouri came back on the next drive after a 37-yard kick return by senior Bobby Guillory. The Mules went 56 yards in nine plays, capped by a one-yard TD plunge from Czerniewski but the Bearcats had the last strike before the break.

A 56-yard completion from Steve Gachette to Johnnie King with 1:01 left was the difference, making it 21-20 at halftime.

Central Missouri committed eight penalties in the opening half, while SBU had five. Both offenses were potent, with

nearly 300 yards apiece as well.

The Bearcats got some luck to start the second half, scoring on a 35-yard touchdown pass that bounced off an SBU receiver and fell into tight end Jameson Manuma's hands for an easy coast into the end zone, making it 28-20 with 7:05 left in the third. That would be the last score for the Bearcats though, as the Mule defense put the clamps down.

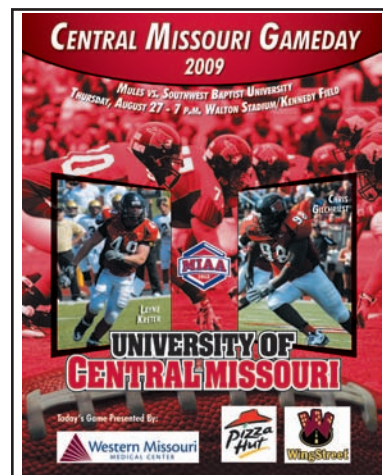
The Mules finished the game with four sacks, six quarterback hurries, and nine tackles for loss, but the biggest play came after the Mules got a 30-yard touchdown reception from junior running back Tywon Hubbard to make it 28-26 (failed two-point conversion). Freshman defensive back Brett Ginn forced a fumble and recovered it on the SBU 35.

The Mules punched it in on a 5-yard hookup to Cosby early in the fourth quarter to give the Mules a lead for good, 32-28. The score tied a school record for TD's in a game by a tight end with two.

The game-killer came later in the quarter though. SBU was stuffed on a fake punt back at their own 39, and they Mules then took six minutes off the clock before stuffing it in the endzone on 1-yard rush from Stewart with 2:14 left.

Stewart finished the game with team highs in receiving (104 yards) and rushing (70 yards), while Cosby had seven grabs for 77 yards. As a team the offense finished with 473 total yards (354 passing, 119 rushing).

Defensively the Mules were led by junior linebacker Cody Scribner with 10 tackles, while senior defensive end Marc Tiernan had 1.5 sacks and seven tackles. Ginn also had a half sack to go with his fumble recovery. UCM gave up 489 yards of offense in the game, but only 200 in the second half, 60 of which came on the final drive of the game.
