2009 Year in Review

The 2009 Mules football team was one win away from making the NCAA Playoffs last season, going 8-3 and wrapping up the program's 11th season with 7 or more wins in the last 13 campaigns.

The Mules started the year 4-0 with non-conference wins over Southwest Baptist and Missouri S&T, both in Thursday night action. The Mules set several records in the against Missouri S&T, including first downs (34), while racking up 582 yards of offense.

They defeated Emporia State 24-21 the next week to open MIAA play, surviving a last-second field goal attempt. The Mules defense bended, but did not break in the fourth quarter of that contest, as the Hornets had the ball for 12:46 and UCM did not allow a point.

The next week Central Missouri upset Pittsburg State 23-14, leading from start to finish after a 97-yard kickoff return from Bobby Guillory. It was the fewest PSU points allowed in a Mules win since 1940 in the series (UCM won that year 20-0), and only the seventh UCM win overall against the Gorillas (first since 83-21 win in 2005). The Mules jumped out to a 23-0 halftime lead, and didn't allow a PSU score until 5:36 remained in the third quarter.

Huge wins over Truman State and Fort Hays State at home followed a mistake-filled road loss to Washburn in week five. The Griffons of Missouri Western took out the Mules for the seventh straight season in a huge game with playoff implications in week eight, jumping out to a 26-7 halftime lead.

The season stayed alive though with a big win over bowl-bound Nebraska-Omaha on the road by a 49-31 margin. The Mules handed the Mavericks their first loss at home on the season, thanks to 35 points in the second half by UCM. The Mules set it up for an all-or-nothing finish to the season after a 27-17 win over Missouri Southern on Senior Day. The Mules had to face eventual national champion Northwest Missouri on the road in the season finale, needing a win to make the playoffs. It

wasn't to be though, as the Bearcats answered an opening drive score by UCM with 56 unanswered points.

Individually, junior running back Anthony Stewart led the team in both rushing with 866 yards, and receiving with 714 yards, while scoring 16 touchdowns. Junior quarterback Eric Czerniewski became the all-time leading passer in school history in yards, touchdowns, and completions. Senior free safety Randy Shepherd finished his career ranked sixth in UCM history with 11 career interceptions while junior linebacker Cody Scribner led the squad with 80 tackles.

11 Mules received postseason recognition for their efforts on the field. Shepherd, senior punter Jordan Hofer, and junior defensive lineman P.J. South all grabbed first-team All-MIAA honors.

Second team all-league honors went to Stewart, junior tight end DeMarco Cosby, and junior defensive end Jeremy Wallace... honorable mention honors went to Czerniewski, senior wide receiver/kick returner Bobby Guillory, sophomore center Nate Stoffel, and senior defensive linemen Chris Gilchrist and Mike Martin.

All-region honors went to Shepherd, Cosby, Stewart, and Hofer. Cosby was named an honorable mention All-American for the second time in his career, while Stewart grabbed honorable mention All-American honors as an all-purpose back from Football Gazette.

After the season Shepherd and Hofer were honored by earning an invitation from the Cactus Bowl to play in the Division II All-Star Game in Kingsville, Texas, and led their team to victory.

Last Time They Met - August 27, 2009

(Warrensburg, Mo.) – The No. 25 Central Missouri Mules tallied the game's final three touchdowns to come back from an eight point deficit and grab a 39-28 season-opening win on Thursday night against the Bearcats of Southwest Baptist.

The Mules (1-0) made it 18 wins in a row over the Bearcats (0-1), extending a streak that has been alive since a 1991 loss.

The Central Missouri offense was paced by junior quarterback Eric Czerniewski, who accounted for five of the Mules six touchdowns (4 passing, 1 rushing). He threw for 354 yards, his third best effort ever, and went 29-of-41 for the second most single-game completions in school history.

The contest started off with a bang as junior running back Anthony Stewart caught a screen pass and took it 70 yards for a score on the Mules first play of their first possession. A missed extra point made it only a 6-0 lead.

UCM made it 13-0 on its next possession, thanks to a 9-play, 60-yard drive. Czerniewski converted a fourth-and-eight with a 25-yard touchdown strike to junior All-American tight end DeMarco Cosby.

The Bearcats answered late in the first quarter with a 51-yard rush by Thaddeus Everson, and then took the lead in the second on a 30-yard rush by Justin Duhaney, 14-13.

Central Missouri came back on the next drive after a 37-yard kick return by senior Bobby Guillory. The Mules went 56 yards in nine plays, capped by a one-yard TD plunge from Czerniewski but the Bearcats had the last strike before the break.

A 56-yard completion from Steve Gachette to Johnnie King with 1:01 left was the difference, making it 21-20 at halftime.

Central Missouri committed eight penalties in the opening half, while SBU had five. Both offenses were potent, with nearly 300 yards apiece as well.

The Bearcats got some luck to start the second half, scoring on a 35-yard touchdown pass that bounced off an SBU receiver and fell into tight end Jameson Manuma's hands for an easy coast into the end zone, making it 28-20 with 7:05 left in the third. That would be the last score for the Bearcats though, as the Mule defense put the clamps down.

The Mules finished the game with four sacks, six quarterback hurries, and nine tackles for loss, but the biggest play came after the Mules got a 30-yard touchdown reception from junior running back Tywon Hubbard to make it 28-26 (failed two-point conversion). Freshman defensive back Brett Ginn

forced a fumble and recovered it on the SBU 35.

The Mules punched it in on a 5-yard hookup to Cosby early in the fourth quarter to give the Mules a lead for good, 32-28. The score tied a school record for TD's in a game by a tight end with two.

The game-killer came later in the quarter though. SBU was stuffed on a fake punt back at their own 39, and they Mules then took six minutes off the clock before stuffing it in the endzone on 1-yard rush from Stewart with 2:14 left.

Stewart finished the game with team highs in receiving (104 yards) and rushing (70 yards), while Cosby had seven grabs for 77 yards. As a team the offense finished with 473 total yards (354 passing, 119 rushing).

Defensively the Mules were led by junior linebacker Cody Scribner with 10 tackles, while senior defensive end Marc Tiernan had 1.5 sacks and seven tackles. Ginn also had a half sack to go with his fumble recovery. UCM gave up 489 yards of offense in the game, but only 200 in the second half, 60 of which came on the final drive of the game.

The Series & Coaches

This is the 23rd meeting between Southwest Baptist and Central Missouri. The Mules have won the last 18 meetings with the Bearcats, dating back to 1991. They have scored more than 40 points on them 10 different times and have scored at least 30 the last 12 in a row. The Mules lead the overall series 20-2.

Svoboda is 0-0 against the Bearcats at UCM, and 9-1 while at Northwest Missouri (won the last nine in a row), while Keith Allen is 0-2 as a head coach, and 0-3 as an assistant at SBU against UCM.

Jim Svoboda is in his first season as the head coach at Central Missouri, and has a 0-0 overall mark. He spent 10 seasons as the offensive coordinator at Northwest Missouri from 1994-2003, and won two national championships. He also spent three seasons at UCLA as the quarterbacks coach and offensive coordinator. His overall record is 52-19 as a head coach, all at Nebraska Wesleyan from 1987-93.

Keith Allen is in his fourth season at Southwest Baptist as the head coach after serving as the defensive coordinator and assistant head coach the prior two seasons. He has a 11-22 overall record there and is 0-14 against MIAA opposition.

Scouting the Bearcats

Southwest Baptist comes into 2010 after a 6-5 mark last year. They competed in the Independent Collegiate Athletic Association and eight starters on their high-powered offense, including quarterback Steve Gachette.

Gachette led the offense to 33.9 points per game last season, and was named the Independent Football's Player of the Year. He threw for 3,015 yards with 28 TD's and ran for 975 more with eight TD's. The Bearcats had three different receivers with 50+ catches, including 6-3 wideout Charles Johnson, who tallied eight TD's and 766 yards.

The defense struggled, allowing 29.6 points and 437.1 yards per outing last season. They return only three starters from that unit, including defensive tackle Ino Vitale, defensive end Casey Smith, and cornerback Anthony Wiggins.

Senior Experience

The Mules return 15 total starters from last year's squad, and boast 24 seniors from a team that went 8-3 last season. Of those 24 seniors, 10 of them are spending their fifth year at Central Missouri, including the all-time leading passer in quarterback Eric Czerniewski, and two-time All-American tight end DeMarco Cosby.

For Openers

The Mules have won the season lidlifter 11 of the last 12 years. The only loss on opening day during that stretch came in 2007 at Minnesota State by a 23-14 margin.

The Mules have opened the season on the road five times during that stretch, going 4-1. The last time UCM started the season away from home was in 2007 at Minnesota State, and the last time the Mules started with two consecutive road games was in 2004, going 2-0 against Adams State (Colo.) and Lincoln (Mo.).

Outside the Conference

UCM has been nearly unbeatable in non-conference regular season games during the last 25 games. They have won 24 of those contests with the lone loss coming to Minnesota State in 2007. Last year the Mules went 2-0, defeating Southwest Baptist 39-28 and Missouri S&T 50-13.

This will be only the third time the Mules have faced Southwest Baptist outside of MIAA play ever. The others include a 1987 meeting that the Mules won 41-3 before SBU joined the MIAA, and last season's win after they left the MIAA in only football starting in 2008.

Running Game = Success

The Mules are 55-5 since the 2001 season when they have outgained their opponents on the ground versus a 15-24 mark when they have been outrushed by their opponents.

Turnover Ratio

The Mules are 45-8 since 2001 when they have won the turnover battle compared to 13-14 when they have committed more turnovers. They are also 11-8 when both teams are tied in turnovers. Following is the break down for positive/negative

With a Win...

It would be the first for head coach Jim Svoboda at UCM, and the first for him as a head coach since 1993.

UCM would extend the win streak over SBU to 19 in a row.

In the Polls

The Mules are receiving votes in the first AFCA national poll with 11. The MIAA currently has four teams in the top 20 of the poll, while Super Region 4 is represented with 9 of the top 20 teams in the nation. There are also 15 teams from the region receiving votes.

The highest ranking for Mules football was No. 6, back in October of 2002. UCM has been ranked in 67 polls since the AFCA started the coaches poll in 2000.

This Week in Mules Football

The Cosby Hour

Junior tight end **DeMarco Cosby** is one of two of the Mules returning All-Americans and was honored with preseason honorable mention All-American honors by Consensus Draft Services this season. This is the second year in a row he was named a preseason All-American.

He was named an All-American at tight end for the second consecutive year, making him the first multiple honoree since Kendall Ricketts did it three times from 2005-07.

Super Czerniewski

Mules junior quarterback **Eric Czerniewski** keeps moving up the charts coming into the 2010 season. **He is the all-time leader in TD passes, completions, yards, total offense and TD's responsible for.** He holds the school record for passing yards (2,938) and total offense (3,010) in a season, as well as touchdowns responsible for (33). He has also had seven 300-yard passing games to break that mark.

Last season, he extended the career record with his ninth 300-yard of total offense game, and his 32 completions vs. WU broke a school record that has stood since Jeff Phillips had 31 back in 1986. His 52 pass attempts in that game also ranks tied for second in school history.

He is also ranked fifth in MIAA history with 7,640 passing yards. He trails only Drew Newhart (MWSU), Adam Hinspeter (MSSU), Eric Howe (TSU), and Kasey Waterman (MWSU).

He ranks in UCM's top two in every statistical passing category:

Speedy Stewart

Junior **Anthony Stewart** led the MIAA in all-purpose yards per game at 146.1 last season, and earned All-American honors as an all-purpose back. This season he will get a chance to best that total as he will be a kick returner as well.

His 16 touchdowns ranked fifth in a single season in UCM history.

That is only one of several records he has set this season: He also has the school records for receptions (54), and yards receiving by a running back in a season (714). His 146 receiving yards against Truman (all in the first half) broke the school record for receiving by a running back. He also had nine receptions against MSSU, breaking the record for receptions in a game by a running back.

Thats Offensive

The Mules return seven starters on an offense that broke several school records last season, including most passing attempts (403), most completions (248), most most yards passing (3,060), most completions in a game (32) and most first downs in a game (34).

Central Missouri has also not been shut out since September 21, 1991 against Missouri Southern. The 214-game streak is the third longest in the nation, and an MIAA record.

New Defense

The Mules will be running a 4-3 defense for the first time in many years (UCM ran a 4-2-5 for much of Willie Fritz' tenure). The new defensive coordinator is Jack Curtis, who came to UCM after 16 years at the Division I level.

Helping the scheme transition from two to three linebackers is the fact that the Mules boast eight LB's with game experience, and four with starting experience.

Solid Foundation

The Mules are coming off of an 8-3 season in 2009, one of nine seasons in the history of Mules football with eight or more victories. Five of those seasons came under former head coach Willie Fritz.

It was the first eight win season since 2003, when the Mules had nine victories.

Versus Ranked Opposition

The Mules are 8-18 against ranked opponents since 2000. They have defeated one ranked opponent in each of the last two seasons (No. 25 WU 43-34 in 2008; No. 11 PSU 23-14 in 2009).

The Mules are 1-11 against teams ranked in the top 10 since 2000. Their last win was No. 10 Emporia State on the road in 2003, 28-18.

The Mules currently have four teams ranked in the top 25 on their schedule.

Mules in the Pros:

There are two Mules on NFL rosters coming into the 2010 season and both are playing for the San Francisco 49ers. Tight end **Delanie Walker (2004-05)** signed a three-year, \$6 million contract with a \$1.8 million signing bonus in 2008. Joining him via a free agent signing this season is **Bobby Guillory (2008-09)**. He has returned both kicks and punts for the 49ers during the preseason.

Mules 39, Southwest Baptist 28

(Warrensburg, Mo.) – The No. 25 Central Missouri Mules tallied the game's final three touchdowns to come back from an eight point deficit and grab a 39-28 season-opening win on Thursday night against the Bearcats of Southwest Baptist.

The Mules (1-0) made it 18 wins in a row over the Bearcats (0-1), extending a streak that has been alive since a 1991 loss.

The Central Missouri offense was paced by junior quarterback Eric Czerniewski, who accounted for five of the Mules six touchdowns (4 passing, 1 rushing). He threw for 354 yards, his third best effort ever, and went 29-of-41 for the second most single-game completions in school history.

The contest started off with a bang as junior running back Anthony Stewart caught a screen pass and took it 70 yards for a score on the Mules first play of their first possession. A missed extra point made it only a 6-0 lead.

UCM made it 13-0 on its next possession, thanks to a 9-play, 60-yard drive. Czerniewski converted a fourth-and-eight with a 25-yard touchdown strike to junior All-American tight end DeMarco Cosby.

The Bearcats answered late in the first quarter with a 51-yard rush by Thaddeus Everson, and then took the lead in the second on a 30-yard rush by Justin Duhaney, 14-13.

Central Missouri came back on the next drive after a 37-yard kick return by senior Bobby Guillory. The Mules went 56 yards in nine plays, capped by a one-yard TD plunge from Czerniewski but the Bearcats had the last strike before the break.

A 56-yard completion from Steve Gachette to Johnnie King with 1:01 left was the difference, making it 21-20 at halftime.

Central Missouri committed eight penalties in the opening half, while SBU had five. Both offenses were potent, with

nearly 300 yards apiece as well.

The Bearcats got some luck to start the second half, scoring on a 35-yard touchdown pass that bounced off an SBU receiver and fell into tight end Jameson Manuma's hands for an easy coast into the end zone, making it 28-20 with 7:05 left in the third. That would be the last score for the Bearcats though, as the Mule defense put the clamps down.

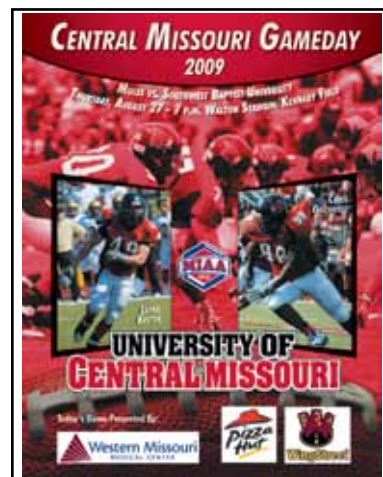
The Mules finished the game with four sacks, six quarterback hurries, and nine tackles for loss, but the biggest play came after the Mules got a 30-yard touchdown reception from junior running back Tywon Hubbard to make it 28-26 (failed two-point conversion). Freshman defensive back Brett Ginn forced a fumble and recovered it on the SBU 35.

The Mules punched it in on a 5-yard hookup to Cosby early in the fourth quarter to give the Mules a lead for good, 32-28. The score tied a school record for TD's in a game by a tight end with two.

The game-killer came later in the quarter though. SBU was stuffed on a fake punt back at their own 39, and they Mules then took six minutes off the clock before stuffing it in the endzone on 1-yard rush from Stewart with 2:14 left.

Stewart finished the game with team highs in receiving (104 yards) and rushing (70 yards), while Cosby had seven grabs for 77 yards. As a team the offense finished with 473 total yards (354 passing, 119 rushing).

Defensively the Mules were led by junior linebacker Cody Scribner with 10 tackles, while senior defensive end Marc Tiernan had 1.5 sacks and seven tackles. Ginn also had a half sack to go with his fumble recovery. UCM gave up 489 yards of offense in the game, but only 200 in the second half, 60 of which came on the final drive of the game.
