

Hill Trophy Winner Czerniewski, Upshaw Award Runner-up Schiechl Headline 2010 *Don Hansen* All-America Team

PITTSBURG, Kan. —Harlon Hill Trophy winning quarterback **Eric Czerniewski** of Central Missouri and Gene Upshaw Award runner-up defensive end **Marc Schiechl** of Colorado Mines headline a talented 2010 *Don Hansen* NCAA Division II All-America Team.

Czerniewski, who captured the Harlon Hill Trophy as the Division II National Player of the Year honors, garnered *Don Hansen* Offensive Player of the Year accolades. Schiechl, who finished second behind Slippery Rock offensive center **Brandon Fusco** for the Gene Upshaw Award as the National Lineman of the Year recognition, received *Don Hansen* National Defensive Player of the Year honors.

Fusco, a first-team All-America selection, received the eighth annual NCAA-II Rimington Award as the division's top offensive center. †

Angelo State return specialist **Garrett Tidwell**, who returned three kicks for scores and ranked in the top 10 nationally in both punt returns and kickoff returns, was selected the *Don Hansen* National Special Teams Player of the Year.

Bloomsburg running back **Franklyn Quiteh**, who led Division II in rushing with 2,015 yards and 22 touchdowns, and Pittsburg State linebacker **Nate Dreiling**, who led the division in tackles (160, 13.3 pg), shared *Don Hansen* National Freshman of the Year honors.

Minnesota Duluth's **Bob Nielson**, who led the Bulldogs to an unblemished 15-0 record and the school's second NCAA Division II National Championship in three years, shared *Don Hansen* National Coach of the Year honors with Mercyhurst's **Marty Schaetzle**, who led one of the division's most compelling turnarounds in 2010 with a 10-3 record and an NCAA-II second-round playoff appearance after a 4-7 campaign in 2009.

Czerniewski, a senior from Montgomery City, Mo., completed 447 of 670 passes for a Division II leading 5,207 yards and 46 touchdowns while directing Central Missouri to an 11-3 record and the NCAA-II quarterfinals. He set a Division II passing record with 5,207 yards.

Schiechl, a senior from Lakewood, Colo., logged 66 tackles with 19.0 tackles-for-loss and 12.0 quarterback sacks, while helping the Orediggers to a 9-3 record and an NCAA-II postseason appearance. He finished his decorated career as the NCAA-II all-time quarterback sack leader (46.0).

The *Don Hansen* Division II All-America Team carries out the legacy of long-time small college football advocate Don Hansen, who passed away at age 75 on Aug. 29, 2010. Hansen, from Brookfield, Ill., started and published *Don Hansen's National Weekly Football Gazette* for three decades, selecting NCAA Division II All-America teams for the first time in 1988.

The *Don Hansen* Football Committee selected All-Super Region teams in December and early January, with the first-team and second-team All-Super Region players advancing to the national ballot.

A total of 167 players earned some form of *Don Hansen* All-America honors. Players from 77 of the 150 football-playing schools in Division II earned *Don Hansen* All-America accolades. National Champion Minnesota Duluth and national semifinalist NW Missouri State led the way by placing nine players apiece on All-America squad.

† The Boomer Esiason Foundation, which established the Dave Rimington Trophy in 2000 to honor the outstanding NCAA BCS center, expanded that award in 2003 to include the top center on the NCAA FCS, DII, DIII and NAIA All-America squads. The Rimington Trophy web site is located at www.rimingtontrophy.com. Esiason, a high-octane Maryland quarterback, and Rimington, a nonpareil center for Nebraska, were NFL teammates at Cincinnati in the mid-1980s.

In 1993, Esiason created the New York City based foundation that bears his name to raise funds for the treatment and research of cystic fibrosis, a genetic disease his son Gunnar has battled since infancy.
