Kegan Coleman named MIAA Performer of the Year by internet new source

(WARRENSBURG, Mo.) – Central Missouri State sophomore tailback **Kegan Coleman** has been named MIAA Performer of the Year by DOPKE.com, a full-service intercollegiate athletics news source that features professional analysis and consulting as well as the publishing of industry news and information.

Coleman, a 5-8, 190 pound Lee's Summit, Mo. native, led the Mules with 262 carries for 1,484 yards, an average of 5.3 yards per carry. He also led the MIAA in scoring with 24 touchdowns (22 rushing, one receiving, and one on a kickoff return) to establish new Central Missouri State records for rushing and total touchdowns and scoring. He was a unanimous first-team All-Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association selection, a Daktronics Division II All-Midwest Region team pick, and an honorable mention All-American by D2Football.com. Coleman helped the Mules finish the 2002 season with a record of 10-2, 8-1 and second in the MIAA, and a trip to the NCAA Division II Football Playoffs for the first time in school history.
