Sterling no match for CMSU Mules

In their final non-conference game of the 2002 season, the Central Missouri State University Mules served notice that they can score fast, often, and from anywhere on the field. The Mules, playing their home opener before a crowd of 4,780, thrashed the Sterling College Warriors 72-12 last Saturday at Walton Stadium/Kennedy Field.

Central scored on offense (five rushing touchdowns, two passing). They scored on defense (a 24-yard interception return by junior linebacker **Jason Vanloo**). And they scored on special teams (nine extra points, a 34-yard field goal, a blocked punt returned for a touchdown, and an 84-yard kickoff return for a TD).

Defensively, the Mules were equally dominant, holding Sterling to just two yards rushing on 30 carries and 149 yards on 32 pass attempts. Central also forced three fumbles, recovering a pair.

It didn't take long for the Mules to take the lead, as senior wide receivers **Don Robinson** and **Todd Devoe** hooked up on a 60-yard reverse pass for a TD just :21 into the game.

Sophomore tailback **Kegan Coleman** scored the first of his three touchdowns in the game on a 20-yard run at the 11:48 mark of the first quarter, and just over two minutes later, Robinson and Devoe paired up again for a score. This time it was on special teams, though, as Devoe blocked a Sterling punt and Robinson gathered in the ball and raced 42-yards for the score.

After a 34-yard field goal by junior **Pat Wilson**, the Warriors got on the board on a 14-yard pass from Terry Harrison to Shane Crow. The extra point attempt was blocked by defensive end **David Williams**.

Coleman answered, as he took the ensuing kickoff 84 yards to paydirt to end the first quarter scoring.

In the second quarter it was more of the same. Robinson hauled in a 27-yard pass from senior quarterback **Dennis Gile** in the back corner of the endzone to make it 37-6, Mules. Vanloo's interception return gave the Cardinal & Black a 44-6 lead, and then Coleman added another 20-yard TDscamper to make it 51-7 Mules.

Junior tailback **Lee Thompson's** three-yard touchdown plunge at 5:05 put Central on top 58-6 with 5:05 left in the half, and effectively ended the night for the Mules' starters.

Junior **Kevin O'Sadnick**, seeing his first extensive action at tailback, scored a pair of second-half touchdowns on runs of 12 and 1 yard, respectively, sandwiched around a two-yard plunge by Sterling's Marcello Peters. O'Sadnick led the Mules' in rushing in the game with 143 yards on 19 carries. Thompson added 81 yards on 13 attempts, and moved into sixth place in school history in rushing. He now has 1,814 yards for his career.

On the defensive side, senior bandit **Brian Riley** had five tackles, while junior defensive end **Roderick Green** added four stops, three for losses.

The Mules racked up 299 yards rushing on 43 carries (an average of 7.0 yards per rush) and completed 7-of-9 passes for 120 yards.

Missouri Western improved to 2-0 with win at South Dakota

The Missouri Western State College defense lifted the Griffons to 2-0 in the non-conference portion of its schedule, keeping the University of South Dakota Coyotes out of the endzone in a 10-3 victory on September 7 in the DakotaDome on the campus of USD.

The Griffons got just enough offense in the game to stay undefeated on the young season. Sophomore quarterback **Michael Cooper** found his classmate at wide receiver, **Johnathan Schoonover**, for a 13-yard scoring strike in the second quarter that turned out to be the only TD of the game for either team. That score put the Griffons on top 7-3 at halftime.

Freshman placekicker **Dane Broadie** hit a 36-yard field goal with 7:36 remaining in the fourth quarter to give Western some breathing room and allow the defense to grind out the victory.

The Griffon defense limited South Dakota to just 263 yards of total offense on its home turf. Western allowed its first 100-yard rusher in the game, but did not allow the Coyotes a trip inside the red-zone.

Senior defensive lineman **Jason Chancellor** led all Griffons with seven total tackles, including a sack and a forced fumble. Chancellor also recorded three tackles for a loss of 11 yards. Junior linebacker **Wilson Curtis** added seven tackles with one interception. Western forced three Coyote interceptions and a fumble lost in the game. Senior linebacker **Eric Walker** and junior **Chris Eads** recorded the other two INT's.

Offensively, Western was led by running back **Derrick Pitts** who rushed for 84 yards on 19 carries.

The Series

This is the 19th meeting between Central Missouri State University and Missouri Western State College. In what has always been a ruggedly contested, hard-fought battle, the Mules lead the series 11-6-1. Central has won three of the last four meetings, and won last year's encounter 34-28 in Warrensburg.

The Coaches

Mules head coach **Willie Fritz** is in his sixth season as head coach at Central Missouri State University. He is 39-19 as the Mules' mentor, 27-18 vs. MIAA opponents. His .667 winning percentage is third best in CMSU football history, while his 39 career wins rank fourth. In 2001, he led the Mules to a 10-2 record, the most wins ever by a CMSU football team in a single season, and to the Mineral Water Bowl, Central's first post-season action since 1970.

Prior to taking the reins at Central, Fritz led Blinn College to back-to-back undefeated junior college national championships in 1995 and 1996. A 1983 graduate of Pittsburg State University, where he was a four-year starter at defensive back, Fritz received his master's degree in kinesiology from Sam Houston State University in 1986.

He is not the first member of his family to coach at Central, either, as his father, the late Harry Fritz, was the Mules' head football coach in 1952 and later became executive director of the NAIA.

Jerry Partridge, like Willie Fritz, is in his sixth season as head coach of the Missouri Western State College Griffons. It is his first stint as a college head coach. A 1985 graduate of Missouri Western, he is 35-23 as the Griffons head coach.

Central opens season with 135 points in two games

One week after posting the 10th largest margin of victory in school history (a 63-7 win over Lincoln University), the Mules recorded the eighth-largest margin of victory in school history last Saturday when they downed Sterling 72-12. The 135 points the Mules have scored in their first two games this season mark the largest scoring output in two games in Central's history.

Mules moving up in career charts

Two Central Missouri State gridders are working their way up the Mules career charts. With his 13 carry, 81 yard night vs. Sterling, junior running back **Lee Thompson** moved into sixth place on Central's all-time list with 1,814 yards. Thompson needs 103 yards to overtake Dane Henningsen (1974-77) and move into the top five in Mules Football history. He then can take a run at Mark Brown (1987-90) for fourth, as he needs 208 yards for that spot. Thompson, a native of Liberty, Mo., needs 341 yards for third (Ira Clemons, 1969-73), 830 yards for second (Henry Caldwell, 1990-93), and 1,510 yards for the Mules Football record held by Elliott Eley (1985-88).

Senior quarterback Dennis Gile, meanwhile, is 298 yards away from Nick Puhlick (1987-90) in seventh place, and is 549 yards shy of Steve Howard (1971-74) in sixth.
