## \*\*2007 MIAA Co-Champions\*\*

**The Game:** After finishing the regular season as MIAA co-champions the Jennies will host the inaugural MIAA tournament Saturday and Sunday. UCM will host SBU in the first semifinal with Washburn and Truman squaring off in the second semifinal. The winners will meet for the MIAA tournament championship on Sunday at 2:30 p.m. The winner of the conference tournament receives an automatic bid to the NCAA tournament.

### Last time out

**Northwest Missouri State:** Needing two victories in their final two games to claim a share of the conference title the Jennies took care of step one, beating Northwest Missouri State 2-0 on Friday night at Jennies Field. The Jennies took a 1-0 lead on an own goal in the 26th minute. UCM iced the game in the 66th minute when **Lindsay Hoerl** drilled home a pass from **Hazel Cox** to put the Jennies up 2-0. **Liz Casey** collected her ninth win and fifth shutout of the season in net.

**Truman State:** The Jennies completed the weekend sweep thus earning a share of the MIAA title with a thrilling 1-0 overtime win over the Bulldogs on Saturday night. Each team had seven shots in regulation without a goal, but on UCM's first shot of the overtime period **Hazel Cox** scored the game winner - her third of the season - off an assist from **Melanie Hall**. **Liz Casey** was great again in net earning her 10th win and sixth shutout of the season while making three saves.

**MIAA Honors:** The Jennies swept this week's Brine/MIAA Soccer Players of the week honors. **Hazel Cox** was named the offensive player of the week for her performance over the weekend. Cox had one goal and one assist including the game-winner against Truman. **Liz Casey** was named the defensive player of the week. She recorded two shutouts in the wins over NWMSU and Truman.

**The Coaches:** **Lewis Theobald** in his first season at the helm of the Jennies soccer program has led UCM to its first MIAA soccer title in school history. His career records stands at 12-4-2, 10-3-1 in the MIAA. He spent last season as the first assistant at Division I Indiana State where he was the lead recruiter. He was also in charge of scouting as well as game and player evaluations. He is a 1999 graduate of the University of Kansas.

**Ben Wade** is in his third year as the head man at Southwest Baptist. His record at SBU is 23-20-11. He is a 1993 graduate of the University of Tennessee.

**Mike Cannon** is in his 15th season as head coach of the Truman State Bulldogs. His career record stands at 197-70-25 including a 13-5-1 mark this season. He is a 1992 graduate of Truman State.

**Tim Collins** is in his fifth year leading the Washburn women's soccer program. His career record stands at 45-35-19 including a 10-5-5 mark this season.

**The Series:** This will be the 22nd meeting and third of the season between UCM and Southwest Baptist. The season series is tied 1-1 with each team winning on the other's home field. The Jennies lead the overall series 13-8.

If the Jennies win they will face the winner of Truman State and Washburn in Sunday's championship game. The Jennies are 1-0-1 against Truman this season and 1-1 against Washburn.

**Southwest Baptist:** The Lady Bearcats enter the MIAA tournament as the No. 4 seed. They finished the regular season with an overall record of 9-7-2 and 8-5-1 in the MIAA. SBU enters the MIAA tournament after going 1-1 last weekend. The Lady Bearcats beat Emporia State 5-0 on Friday before dropping a 2-1 double overtime game to Washburn on Saturday. SBU is lead by Dominie Emmanuel (10g, 2a) and goalkeeper Aline Lopes (0.76 GAA and five shutouts).

**Truman State:** The Bulldogs enter the MIAA tournament as the second seed after tying for the regular season conference title with UCM. TSU was 1-1 last weekend, beating Missouri Western 2-1 before dropping a 1-0 OT decision to the Jennies. TSU will play a non-conference game against Drury on Tuesday before the MIAA tournament. Truman is lead offensively by Jessica Wiegart (6g, 5a) and Katie Reuck (7g, 3a).

**Washburn:** The Lady Blues enter the conference tournament as the No. 3 seed and will face Truman State in the first round. Washburn tied Missouri Southern and beat SBU in double overtime last weekend to secure the No. 3 slot. The Lady Blues are led by Jessica Mainz (15g, 7a), Danielle Ayala (9g, 5a) and the goalkeeping tandem of Ashley Klone (0.57 GAA, five shutouts) and Jenny Persons (1.10 GAA, two shutouts).

**Jennies in NCAA Central Region:** The Jennies stayed at No. 5 this week in the NCAA Central region rankings. The top six teams in the region at the end of the season qualify for the NCAA tournament.

**MIAA statistical leaders:** **Liz Casey** is first in the MIAA in goals against average (0.63), shutouts (6) and sixth in saves per game (3.36). **Lindsay Hoerl** and **Hazel Cox** are tied for fourth with three game-winning goals. Cox is also fifth in the MIAA in shots per game (3.31), points per game (1.00) and goals per game (0.38). **Melanie Hall** is seventh in goals per game (0.33). As a team the Jennies are tied with Truman for the most shutouts in the MIAA with nine.
