The Games: Central Missouri heads back to Texas this week to participate in the Texas A&M-Commerce Tournament. The Jennies will face Lone Star Conference preseason No. 1 in West Texas A&M on Friday at 3 p.m., then close out the tournament against host Texas A&M-Commerce with a 1:30 p.m. whistle on Sunday.

The Week in Review

Abilene Christian - UCM outshot ACU 8-5 as the Jens also had eight corner kicks. **Melanie Hall** attempted five shots, four of which were on goal. **Sharaya Sidebottom** had two shots as **Kelsie Hanson** recorded one. The Jennies kept the game scoreless until the middle of the second half when Abilene Christian found the back of the net to capture the 1-0 victory.

Midwestern State - UCM outshot MSU 16-7 as **Melanie Hall** recorded eight shots, three on goal. **Kayla Jupp** shot three times as **Kayla Shain**, **Alyssa Rhodes**, **Kelsie Hanson**, **Katie O'Keefe** and **Cara Hennahane** all had one. Central Missouri dropped its second game of the season, 1-0, as Midwestern State scored in the eighth minute and held on for the win.

The Coaches

Lewis Theobald is in his third season at the helm of the Jennies soccer program. He led the Jens to back-to-back conference titles and has posted a 28-8-6 overall mark. He was the first assistant at Division I Indiana State where he was the lead recruiter before coming to UCM. He is a 1999 graduate of the University of Kansas.

Butch Lauffer enters his 14th season as head coach at West Texas A&M. He led the Lady Buffs to a 16-4-1 overall record and an 8-2-0 conference mark, tying for first in the league. Lauffer has a career record of 175-64-12. Lauffer graduated from Texas Christian.

Neil Piper began his 12th season at the helm of the Lions. He led Texas A&M-Commerce last season to a 16-4-3 overall record and a 7-1-2 mark in the conference, tying for first. Piper has posted a 140-64-18 career record. Piper's alma matter is Wichita State

The Opponents

West Texas A&M: The Lady Buffs opened their 2009 season going 2-0 last weekend with a 3-0 shutout over New Mexico Highlands and a 2-0 win against Texas-Permian Basin. Mariam Dominguez tallied three goals and two assists in the two games. Adi Stein added a goal, as the team was credited with the fifth of the weekend. This will be the first meeting between the two programs.

No 16 Texas A&M-Commerce: The Lions went 2-0 last weekend, shutting out Mars Hill (5-0) and Tusculum (1-0) in Greenville, Tenn. Devon Herrman scored three goals and assisted on another against Mars Hill. Chelsey Haight, Meagan Lasley and Whitney Hancock all scored one goal in the games over the weekend. The series is tied at one game apiece as TAMC shutout the Jens 2-0 in the NCAA Tournament on November 16, 2008 in Warrensburg.

Jennies against ranked opponents: Central Missouri is 4-1-2 under Coach Theobald against ranked opponents and 5-6-2 against ranked opponents since 2005. UCM defeated No. 5 Nebraska-Omaha and No. 9 Truman last season. The Jens will face a nationally ranked opponent in No. 22 Texas A&M-Commerce.

Slow Out of the Gates: The last time UCM lost its first two games of the season was in 2003. The Jens ended that season with a 7-11-1 overall record and a 6-7-1 conference mark for a fourth-place finish.

Taking Shots: Melanie Hall recorded 13 shots in the two games over the weekend, a team and conference high. She had five against Abilene Christian and eight versus Midwestern State, more than the entire Mustangs team. Hall is also the first Jenny to record more than six shots in a single game. She now has 154 in her career as a Jenny, moving her into fourth place on the all-time list.
