**The Games:** The Jennies (10-4-2, 5-4-2 MIAA) will close out the regular season this week with three road contests beginning on Wednesday traveling to Kirksville to take on Truman (10-4-3, 5-3-3 MIAA) in an important regional match-up at 2:00 pm. The Jens will then head up to the northwest part of the state to take on Northwest Missouri (9-8, 5-7 MIAA) on Saturday at 2:00 pm in Maryville and they will close out the regular season on Sunday taking on Missouri Western (1-13-3, 0-11-1 MIAA) at 2:00 pm in St. Joe.

### Last Time Out

#### Washburn

The Central Missouri Jennies soccer team came out on the wrong end of a 1-0 decision last Wednesday against the #15 Washburn Lady Blues in Warrensburg.

The Jens had a chance to break on top in the 10th minute when **Landri Schmitt** beat her defender and got past the keeper, but her shot was deflected and cleared off the line to keep the game scoreless. WU had a similar opportunity almost 18 minutes later but the shot was blocked. The Jens out shot the Lady Blues 5-3 in the opening half and 4-2 on goal.

In the second half the Jennies came out firing with four shots in the first 10 minutes of the second half but were unable to put one in the back of the net. WU would get the lone goal in the 58th minute when Lauren Schwindt received a throw in dribbled across the field and then fired a shot from the top of the box past a diving **Liz Casey**. The Jens would only get two more shots off the rest of the game.

#### Emporia State

On Friday, Central Missouri honored its lone senior **Mallory Milburn** with a 5-0 whitewashing of the Hornets.

The Jennies scored four goals in a 13 minute span in the opening half led by **Kayla Jupp** who put two in the back of the net for her second and third goals of the season. **Hazel Cox** and **Melanie Hall** would also score in the opening half. The Jens out shot Emporia 15-2 in the opening half and put four of those in the goal.

In the second half **Madeline Baker** scored the final goal off a shot from deep in the corner that curled inside the far post. Milburn had a couple of opportunities to score in her final home game, but the ESU keeper made a couple of great saves.

For the game UCM out shot Emporia State 26-8 and 8-5 on goal. Casey and **Shannon Ponche** combined for fives saves to share the shutout.

**The Coaches:** **Geoff VanDeusen** is in his fourth season with the Jennies after guiding them to a 11-8-1 mark in his third campaign. He has an overall record of 85-89-16 and is 32-35-8 during his tenure at Central Before coming to UCM, VanDeusen was at Missouri Southern where he took the Lions from 1-16-1 to 11-5-2 in four seasons. VanDeusen was a goalkeeper at the Division I level.

**Mike Cannon** is in his 14th season as head coach at Truman State. A 1992 graduate of TSU, he has won seven straight MIAA championships and compiled a record of 182-64-24, 69-7-9 in conference action, while leading them to five NCAA Tournament appearances. Cannon is the winningest coach in Truman women's soccer history.

**Tracy Cross** is in her fourth season at Northwest Missouri State compiling a record of 21-45-9. Last season she guided them to a 5-8-5 mark, 4-6-4 in the MIAA finishing sixth in the final conference standings.

**Jeff Hansen** is in his first season as head coach at Missouri Western after spending the last two years as an assistant with the Jens. He is 1-13-3 picking up his first win in the Griffons 3-2 win over Concordia-St. Paul.

**The Series:** UCM trails TSU in the all-time series 2-14-1 with the Bulldogs winning the first match-up of the season 1-0 in Warrensburg on Oct. 6th. The Jens are 1-7-1 in Kirksville and have not won their since 2001.

The Jennies lead the Bearcats 9-2-2 in the series after winning the first game 2-0 in Warrensburg. Central Missouri is 2-2-2 in Maryville and haven't won their since winning 2-0 in 2002.

UCM has won all three games against the Griffons, winning the earlier meeting 5-0 at home. The Jens have won the only meeting in St. Joseph.

**Truman:** Since defeating the Jennies on Oct. 6th the Bulldogs have struggled going 1-2-1 snapping a three match winless streak with a 2-0 win over Emporia State on Sunday. Jessica Wiegert and Lauren Hawks have each scored seven goals to lead the offense. Lauren Davis has allowed only seven goals in 14 matches this year.

**Northwest Missouri:** The Bearcats come into Saturday's game having dropped two straight this past weekend to Southwest Baptist and Missouri Southern on the road. Kayla Griffin has scored six goals to lead the offense while Alison Sheridan has posted four shut outs in between the pipes this season.

**Missouri Western:** The Griffons have gone winless in their last 14 games after losing to SBU and MSSU this past weekend. Meigan Soo is the leading scorer for MWSU with seven points and has found the back of the net three times for an offense that has scored only nine goals. Missouri Western has allowed 41 goals for the season.

**Race for the NAAs:** The Jennies are in a position to make their first ever NCAA Tournament this season. If the Jens win their final three games they will more than likely head to Omaha, Nebraska for the Central Regional on Nov. 3rd and 5th.

**Two's the Magic Number:** Over the last two seasons UCM is 19-0 when they score at least two goals in a contest. They have not lost a game when scoring at least two goals since losing to NWMSU 5-3, in Nov. 2004

**Score Fast and Score Early:** This season the Jennies have out scored their opponents 19-4 in the opening half and are 8-0 when taking a lead into the break. The Jens have only trailed once in the first stanza this year and this at Washburn. Central Missouri is 10-0-1 when they score the first goal compared to 0-4 when the opponent scores first.

**Jens in the MIAA:** UCM is ranked first in three of four offensive categories and ranked second in the other. The Jennies are ranked first in shots per game with 17.3, first in points per game with 6.00, and first in assists at 1.75 pg. They are ranked second in goals scoring 34 times for an average of 2.12 pg.
