Last Time Out:

Jennies sweep season series with Cougars

(WARRENSBURG, Mo.) – For the second time in five days, the No. 7 University of Central Missouri Jennies volleyball squad knocked off a fellow ranked team in No. 14 Southern Illinois-Edwardsville, 3-1 Wednesday night.

The Jennies (9-1, 1-0 MIAA) led for most of game one, dispatching the Cougars (6-3) by a 30-20 margin. SIUE showed why they were ranked in the top 15 in the second game by pulling away early for a 30-24 win. The third stanza was back and forth; with 13 ties and four lead changes. The two teams were deadlocked at 22 before the Jennies made their move, scoring the next five points en route to a 30-26 winner. The final period was close until the Jens made a six point run after being tied at 12. They pulled away even further late to finish off the Cougars 30-21.

Jillian Ohrman led UCM with 18 kills and added a .519 hitting percentage. The star of the night was setter **Caitlin Pankratz** though. She tied a career-high with 62 assists (15.5 per game), which she actually had in a five-game match last season against West Florida. Four Jennies finished in double-figure kills on the night including **Andrea Robertson** with 15, **Amber Yoder** with 12, and **Brooke Butler** with 10 (.588 hitting percentage). Robertson also logged a career-high 18 digs for a double-double and **Audrey Jensen** led the defense with 27 digs.

Central Missouri heads to Boston, Mass. this weekend for the Bentley Invitational. They kick off the tournament with Bryant University (R.I.) on Friday.

No. 7 Jens kick off MIAA with win over Hornets

(Emporia, Kan.) –Jennies volleyball had to come from behind to drop Emporia State University in the MIAA conference opener, 3-1, on Tuesday evening in Emporia, Kansas.

Central Missouri (8-1, 1-0 MIAA) lost game one to the Hornets (6-3, 0-1 MIAA) 21-30, but bounced back to win three games in a row for the match win (30-22, 30-13, 30-24).

The Jens were led by 17 kills from senior **Amber Yoder**. **Jillian Ohrman** chipped in 12 kills and **Andrea Robertson** had a double-double with 11 kills and 15 digs. **Caitlin Pankratz** continues to lead the Jennies in assists on the season registering her second best mark of 47 in the contest.

Audrey Jensen turned in a season high 36 digs in the match. Freshman **Rachel Fister** had 15 digs while **Carrie Peterson** chipped in 10.

Jennies volleyball claims top spot in silver bracket at D-II Challenge

(Denver, Colorado)- Jennies volleyball (7-1) claimed the top spot in the Silver Bracket of the 2007 Colorado Premier Challenge in Denver with a pair of match victories Saturday to go 3-1 on the weekend. After splitting matches on Friday, the Jennies topped California State-Los Angeles in their first match Saturday 3-0 and then prevailed 3-2 in their evening battle with SIU-Edwardsville.

In game one on Friday against Augustana (S.D.) the Jennies lost 3-0 in three close games, they fell behind early in each of the sets and failed to recover. (28-30, 27-30, 28-30). Central Missouri was led with 10 kills a piece by **Jacquelyn Williams** and **Andrea Robertson**. Senior **Jillian Ohrman** also chipped in 10 kills. **Caitlin Pankratz** had 40 assists, while **Audrey Jensen** had 15 digs.

Game two the Jens bounced back with a 3-1 victory over No. 13 Chico State (30-25, 28-30, 30-27, 30-20). Senior **Amber Yoder** led the way with 21 kills. Ohrman had 19 kills in the contest with Pankratz' 56 assists. **Brooke Butler** recorded the first double-double of the season with 11 kills and 10 digs in the match. Jensen led the way in digs with 19.

The Jennies opened up Saturday with a 3-0 win over No.17 Cal State Los Angeles (30-23, 30-17, 30-20). Ohrman led the way with 14 kills in the contest. Pankratz had 32 assists, while Jensen chipped in 15 digs.

Central Missouri finished up the Division II Premier Challenge with a 3-2 win over No. 15 Southern Illinois-Edwardsville (22-30, 32-30, 30-25, 23-30,15-8). Ohrman led the way once again with 17 kills. Robertson also had 12 for the Jennies in the contest. Pankratz had a double-double with 43 assists and 14 digs for the Jens. Jensen led the way again in digs with 21, while freshman **Rachel Fister** chipped in 11.

Ohrman named MIAA Hitter of the week

(WARRENSBURG, Mo.) – **Jillian Ohrman**, a 6-0 senior from Independence, Mo., averaged 4.70 points and hit .358 (60 kills, 17 errors, 120 attempts) as the No. 12 Jennies went 3-1 at the Colorado Premier Challenge last weekend, with all wins coming against ranked opponents.

She hit .505 (14-2-24) and scored 17 points in a 3-0 sweep of No. 17 California State-Los Angeles Saturday (Sept. 1). Ohrman had an assist, a dig, two solo blocks and two block assists against the Golden Eagles.

She scored 19.5 points (17 kills, 1 service ace, 3 block assists) in the 3-2, fifth-place match win over No. 15 Southern Illinois-Edwardsville, and had just one error on 14 service tries.

Ohrman hit .469 (19-4-32) and scored 22.5 points in a 3-1 win Friday (Aug. 31) against No. 13 Chico (Calif.) State -- with an ace on 12 errorless service tries. She hit .412 (10-3-17) and had 11.5 points in a 3-0 setback against Augustana (S.D.).

Ohrman is a graduate of William Chrisman High School, and transferred to UCM from the University of Mississippi after her sophomore season.

The Games: The No. 7 Jennies (9-1) will open tournament play on Friday against Bryant University in the Bentley Invitational in Boston, Massachusetts. They also take on the host Bentley College later on that evening. Central Missouri will take on the University of New Haven on Saturday morning and play Long Island University - C.W. Post later in the day.

The Opponents:

Bryant University

The Bulldogs of the Northeast 10 conference are coming in with a 1-4 record under 12th year head coach Theresa Garlacy. Last year Bryant finished with a 21-19 record and finished third in its conference with a record of 12-2. This will be the first meeting between the two schools.

Bentley College

Bentley College comes into the tournament with a 2-1 record. The Falcons who also play in the Northeast Conference, finished 27-11 in 2006, including a 13-1 record in their conference to finish second. Sandy Hoffman is in her 26th year as head coach. Central Missouri leads the series 1-0.

University of New Haven

The Chargers have started off the season 3-0 thus far. New Haven, who plays in the East Coast conference, finished 23-14 overall and had a second place finish with an 8-1 record. Head coach Robin Salters is in her 14th year as head coach. The Jens lead the series 4-0.

Long Island University - C.W. Post

The Pioneers, who also play in the East Coast Conference come into the tourney with a 5-2 record. Last season Post finished the season at 23-13 and tied for fourth in their conference. Russi Villalta is in her second season as head coach. The Jennies will meet the Pioneers for the first time in school history.

Peggy Martin is in her 32nd year as head coach with a 1013-265-8 record. Under Martin's guidance, the Jennies have won at least 25 matches 28 straight seasons and have won or shared 19 MIAA crowns since the league began sponsoring the sport in 1982. Her teams have also made 24 NCAA Tournament appearances in a row, the most in Division II history, and have reached the "Elite Eight" six times, highlighted by a runner-up national showing in 1987.

Theresa Garlacy enters her 12th season as head coach at Bryant University. Coming into 2007 she has compiled a 312-127 record in 11 years. Last season she led the Bulldogs to a 21-10 record and a third place finish in the Northeast 10 conference.

Sandy Hoffman is in her 26th season as the head coach of Bentley College. She has guided the Falcons to a 638-273 record in her career. Last season she led them to a 27-11 record that included a second place finish in their conference.

Robin Salters is in her 14th season at the University of New Haven. She has compiled a 374-212 career record after 13 seasons. The Chargers finished 23-14 last season and second in the East Coast Conference.

Russi Villalta enters her second season as head coach with a 23-13 record. The Pioneers finished 23-13 and tied for fourth in their conference a year ago.
