Little Award for Management Excellence for his *S.I.M.P.L.E* Speculative Building Program. He is a Certified Economic Developer (CED), a Fellow Member (FM) and Honorary Life Member (HLM) of IEDC. Jim has managed: multi-million dollar marketing and public relations campaigns in the United States and Europe; industrial parks, labor force studies, foreign trade zones; enterprise zones; downtown redevelopment programs; and, as a consultant, strategic plans for communities throughout the west.

Jim is a Ford Foundation Scholar, holds a Masters in Public Administration from Syracuse University's Maxwell School of Public Administration, and has an undergraduate degree *cum laude* from Wesleyan University in Middletown, Connecticut.
