The University of Central Missouri (UCM) Board of Governors convened for a mini retreat at 1:00 p.m. on Wednesday, January 20, 2021, in Union 237A on UCM's main campus in Warrensburg, Missouri. Updates provided by President Best and Vice Presidents Bridgmon, Bax, Hawley and Smedley, centered around enrollment growth and mix; major initiatives currently in progress, and naming opportunities. National and regional enrollment data and the implications for UCM were presented, and more specifically, the implications as they relate to Academic Affairs, Integrated Marketing and Communications, Student Experience and Engagement, and Finance and Administration areas, were discussed. Major initiatives discussed included the instructional faculty promotion process, retrenchment and general education review.
