Voice Audition requirements for admission and scholarship

The Voice Audition for Music consists of the following:

- 1. Singing two pieces of contrasting style.
 - a. Perform from memory.
 - b. Singers are advised to provide their own accompanist; however, one will be provided if needed (music must be available in advance).
 - c. Singing one selection in a foreign language, typically Italian, German, French, or Spanish, is highly recommended, but singing both pieces in English is acceptable.
 - d. Recommended selections include those sung for District Music Festival. http://gvlabs.com/festivalmanager/mshsaa/src/admin_pml.php. Repertoire from other sources is acceptable, but you will be asked to share your selections with Dr. Jackson Thomas (jthomas@ucmo.edu) ahead of your audition time.

2. Sight-reading

- a. Singers may choose solfege, numbers, a neutral syllable (ex: 'la, la, la'), or hum when performing the sight reading.
- b. After being given a starting pitch, singers will have 45 seconds to practice the example aloud.
- 3. You may be asked to sing scales and vocalizes to demonstrate range.

Please note:

- 1. The requirements above are for consideration for music admission and scholarship only. Choral ensemble auditions will take place at a later point in time.
- 2. For the Master of Arts: Contact the Coordinator of Graduate Studies and the applied teacher for your instrument for specific audition requirements and information.
