

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

Between

University of North Alabama

And

University of Central Missouri

January 3, 2022

PURPOSE

This articulation agreement has been established between University of North Alabama (UNA) and the University of Central Missouri, Missouri, USA (UCM). This agreement was developed with the intent of facilitating the path and success of students transferring from University of North Alabama to UCM. This agreement is not meant to override any rules, regulations, or admissions standards and criteria of either institution. It is intended solely to clarify the transfer of course credits between the two partner institutions and serve as a guideline so that the University of North Alabama students can adequately prepare themselves to enter the Aviation Management, BS (Airport Management option or Flight Operations Management option) program at the University of Central Missouri and complete the program successfully.

Students at University of North Alabama completing the described course program regarding general education requirements (pending I-17 approval at University of North Alabama), in accordance with the minimum standards as set in this agreement, will be admitted to the Aviation Management, BS program at UCM.

TERMS OF THE AGREEMENT

Course Requirements

1. This document is based upon evaluation of course descriptions offered by UNA and UCM. UNA courses as listed in this agreement will transfer to the general education requirements for Aviation Management, BS Program at UCM provided students secure a cumulative GPA of 2.5 from UNA.
2. The courses to be taken at UCM for Aviation Management, BS program are clearly indicated in the attached program of study.
3. UNA transfer students will be subject to all General Education requirements as set forth in the UCM catalog.

Admission Process

1. UCM does hereby agree to offer a scholarship to degree-seeking applicants from University of North Alabama with a cumulative undergraduate GPA of 2.5 out of 4 or better and who meet all

other UCM admission requirements, including English proficiency of 61 iBT TOEFL or 5.5 IELTS Academic. Students must maintain a cumulative undergraduate GPA of 2.5 or better throughout the program. Students who otherwise place into UCM's Intensive English Program and who earn a 2.5 while in the program will also qualify for the scholarship upon successful completion of the Intensive English Program. Students must maintain a cumulative 2.5 GPA or better throughout the program to continue receiving the scholarship. Students who fall below the minimum GPA but return to the appropriate level may petition to have the scholarship reinstated.

2. Student must have a cumulative undergraduate GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale.
3. Student must meet all the admissions requirements, including English proficiency of 61 iBT TOEFL or 5.5 IELTS Academic for undergraduates.
4. All students must successfully submit in a timely manner all required elements of UCM's international student online application, to include: application fee, English proficiency scores, official transcripts translated into English, a passport copy, and satisfactory financial documentation.
5. UCM's Graduate and International Student Services will provide a transfer pending I-20 form to qualified applicants after all the specified academic and financial documentation is provided, and after UNA has successfully transferred the SEVIS record to UCM. However, if a student chooses to travel during the break between sessions at the two schools with an expired visa, then it is to be noted that the awarding of a student visa is decided by the appropriate U.S. government official from outside of the U.S.

Pending the I-17 approval of UNA's non-degree general education program, this agreement will be in effect for a period of ten years from the date of its enactment. Each institution agrees to provide timely notice to the other in the event of any modification to the curriculum that might affect the compatibility for admission and transfer of coursework. This agreement may be subject to change, with notification, if curriculum requirements change at either institution. If the UNA non-degree general education program is not approved for UNA's I-17, this agreement is null and void.

The first batch of UNA students to arrive at UCM under this agreement is expected to be in fall 2022 at the earliest.

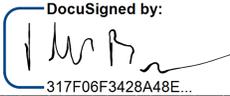
