- Students eligible to receive course credit by examination must be currently enrolled at UCM and are responsible for notifying Testing Services. *Please do not enroll in a course in which you anticipate receiving AP credit.*

Credit by Examination - Eligibility Guidelines

- Only tests taken within the past 10 years are considered for special credit review.
- Duplicate credit is not permitted. Students may not earn credit if they have previously earned a grade in the same course from UCM or another institution as indicated on a transcript. If you have taken a CLEP or International Baccalaureate test for the same course, you will only receive credit once.
- Students must have an official score report (one sent directly from the test company) on file in Testing Services, Humphreys 216, Warrensburg, MO 64093 to be considered for credit.

UCM Degree Audit/Transcript

- Course credit is posted once a student is attending UCM and an official AP score report is received in Testing Services. Certain tests require departmental approval. *Please do not enroll in a course in which you anticipate receiving AP credit.*
- Course credit by examination does not carry a letter grade and does not impact your grade point average.
- Course credit by examination placed on the transcript counts toward credit hours earned but not “enrolled hours” for a semester and may not be useable in a particular degree.
- Refer to the Undergraduate Catalog or your academic advisor for additional information.

Other Opportunities to Consider

- **ENGLISH ACT SCORE** - If you have an ACT English score of 26 or higher and your high school rank is in the upper 50th percentile, you are eligible to enroll in ENGL 1080 Advanced Composition. With an earned grade of “C” or better you will earn 6 credit hours of credit but you will have only paid for three hours!
- **DUAL CREDIT** - see UCM’s dual credit policy for information about earning college credit while in high school.
- **OTHER CREDIT BY EXAMINATION** - UCM also accepts International Baccalaureate (IB) and CLEP scores.
- **VALIDATED CREDIT** - Refer to the Undergraduate Catalog, Modern Languages or contact the department at 660-543-4780.
