MINIMUM HOURS REQUIRED FOR A.A.: 60 hours

MINIMUM HOURS REQUIRED FOR B.S.W.: 120 hours

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REQUIREMENTS FOR THIS MAJOR

- Minimum hours: 120
- Minimum of 30 hours upper level credit (courses numbered 300 and above). Courses taken at MCC do not count toward the upper-level requirement though they sometimes may be articulated as upper level classes.
- Minimum of 12 upper level credit hours in major
- Modern language requirement: No

RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS FOR A DEGREE AT UCM

- 30 credit hours must be completed at UCM
- 20 upper level hours must be completed at UCM
- 15 credit hours in the major must be from UCM
- 9 upper level hours in the major must be completed at UCM
- The last 12 credit hours must be earned from UCM
If pursuing a minor, a minimum of 9 hours in the minor must be completed at UCM. There must also be at least one upper level hour completed at UCM.

MCC A.A. LEARNING ENHANCEMENT REQUIREMENTS

Students must complete a Human Diversity course or Learning Community in addition to a Writing Intensive course to receive an A.A. from MCC. Reference the MCC catalog or talk to an MCC advisor for more information.

TRANSFER WORK
