### REQUIREMENTS FOR THIS MAJOR

- Minimum hours: 120
- Minimum of 30 hours upper level credit (numbered 3000/4000 level); courses taken at SFCC may articulate as upper level classes, but will not count toward the upper level hour requirement.
- Minimum of 12 upper level credit hours in major
- Modern language requirement: No

### RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS FOR A DEGREE AT UCM

- 30 credit hours must be completed at UCM
- 20 upper level hours must be completed at UCM
- 15 credit hours in the major must be from UCM
- 9 upper level hours in the major must be completed at UCM
- The last 12 semester hours must be earned from UCM
- If pursuing a minor, a minimum of 9 hours in the minor must be completed at UCM

### TRANSFER WORK
