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REQUIREMENTS FOR THIS MAJOR

- Minimum hours: 120
- Minimum of 30 hours upper level credit (numbered 3000/4000 level); courses taken at SFCC may articulate as upper level classes, but will not count toward the upper level hour requirement.
- Minimum of 12 upper level credit hours in major
- Modern language requirement: Yes

RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS FOR A DEGREE AT UCM

- 30 credit hours must be completed at UCM
- 20 upper level hours must be completed at UCM
- 15 credit hours in the major must be from UCM
- 9 upper level hours in the major must be completed at UCM
- The last 12 semester hours must be earned from UCM
- If pursuing a minor, a minimum of 9 hours in the minor must be completed at UCM

TRANSFER WORK

Arrange for all transfer work to be posted at UCM at the time of application. An official transcript must be received at UCM directly from each school attended. DUAL ADMISSION

Students are encouraged to apply for dual admission during their first semester at SFCC to coordinate associate degree completion with degree requirements at UCM.

¹MODERN LANGUAGE

Reference the UCM course equivalency guide to determine acceptable modern language equivalencies (www.ucmo.edu/corequiv). Reference the UCM Undergraduate Catalog (www.ucmo.edu/catalogs) for modern languages offered by UCM (note that modern languages should be in the same language). Students who do not take LIT 104 or 105 may take three additional hours of modern language. Alternatively, students can satisfy the language requirement by attaining a proficiency rating of intermediate mid on an ACTFL Oral Proficiency Interview. Non-native speakers of English are understood to fulfill the spirit of the requirement through their English course-work, provided they can show proof of native proficiency in another language.
