#Students must earn 30 hours of 3000/4000 level classes to graduate. Courses may be taken as a combination of crisis and disaster management electives and/or general education courses.

*Service members who have been through basic military training (BMT) receive a total of 11 credit hours from our university. GNED 1925 3 credit hours (Elective Area General Education), HLTH 1100 3 credit hours (Additional Social Science), CJ 3005 3 credit hours (Electives) and remaining 2 credit hours (Electives).

**Course may be repeated for up to 6 credit hours.

###Students transferring to UCM with a CCAF AAS in Emergency Management, Fire Science, Strategic Operations Management, Criminal Justice, and Public Health Technology only need to select 9 hours from these courses as 3 hours credit is granted from CCAF AAS. Students transferring to UCM with a CCAF AAS in all other AFSCs will need to select 12 hours.
