We apologize we do not have all the answers to your questions. We are providing a few more updates since our Sunday, November 10 meeting with Chapter Presidents. In order to keep you informed, we want to provide these updates.

- Dr Brenda Moeder has been working diligently to accommodate your relocation to Ellis and Fitzgerald Halls. Those moves can begin as early as Tuesday evening, November 12 and are to be completed by Sunday evening November 17.
- We are in the process of obtaining a rented vehicle to assist in moving your personal belongings to your new assignment. UCM Housing will provide the vehicle and residents will need to load and unload their belongings. We are checking on availability for Saturday, November 16.
- There will be a floor meeting in your new building on Sunday evening, November 17, where you will meet the staff and be presented some important safety concerns of your new residence. Those meeting times will be 9:00 pm in Fitzgerald hall and 9:30 pm in Ellis Hall.
- Vice President Dr Shari Bax has offered to provide some food for these evening meetings.
- We will provide access to the Fraternity Complex units through Sunday, November 17. After that time, we will secure the units. Limited access to each unit after that date will be coordinated through the Fraternity and Sorority Life Office in Panhellenic.
- We are requesting each chapter president or designee to identify chapter belongings that will be used often and move them to a secured storage location in Panhellenic Hall.
- We will want a chapter president or designee to clearly identify larger items that will remain behind.
- Our plan from UCM Housing and FPO will be to keep the rooftop supplemental heating units operating until the A/C season next spring. We have another meeting this coming Friday to help identify storage for the larger items.
- We anticipate shutting off water later this semester and before the semester break.
- Last and certainly not least, I have been advised some vandalism and destruction has already occurred. If these destructive actions continue, university personnel will request Public Safety Access Control to secure the unit and no access will be provided.
