## Requirements to join AFROTC:

- ✓ Be enrolled in an accredited college that hosts or has a crosstown agreement with an AFROTC detachment
- ✓ Be a U.S. citizen after freshman year
- ✓ Be in good physical condition: cadets must pass the Fitness Assessment
- ✓ Have at least 3 years remaining in pursuit of a degree

## 4-Year AFROTC TIMELINE



**Field Training (FT):** Cadets who earn an enrollment allocation (EA) during their AS 200 year will attend FT the summer before AS 300 year. FT is a 3-week summer training at Maxwell AFB where cadets are evaluated on their leadership potential.



### What is Leadership Lab (LLAB)?

A 2-hour class held once per week. Cadets wear military uniforms or business casual attire and practice leadership skills, drill and ceremonies, and teamwork. Our Crosstown cadets travel to Mizzou weekly to participate.

### What is Physical Training (PT)?

Group workouts held twice per week to improve physical fitness. Workouts focus on cardio and calisthenics to prepare for the Air Force Fitness Test.

### Does joining AFROTC require a military service obligation?

No, cadets do not incur a service obligation by joining AFROTC. For most GMC cadets, remaining within the program is optional. Cadets "contract" at the beginning of their junior year or when activating a scholarship; once contracted, cadets will acquire a service obligation.

## High School Scholarship Program (HSSP)

- ✓ **FULL Tuition** and authorized fees at any public or private institution
- ✓ **On-Campus Housing:** Cadets may convert tuition scholarship for up to **\$10,000** in housing expenses
- ✓ **\$300-\$500** monthly stipend
- ✓ **\$900** textbook allowance per year
- ✓ Initial travel expenses to university paid

## Basic Requirements

- ✓ Be a U.S. citizen by scholarship activation
- ✓ Be at least 17 years old by scholarship activation
- ✓ No previous full-time college experience

## Minimum Academic Requirements

- ✓ GPA: 3.3 unweighted by end of junior year
- ✓ SAT: 1310 **OR** ACT: 28\*\*

*\*\*Note: super scoring of SAT/ACT not permitted*

## Application Dates

- ✓ Opens **July 1st, 2025**
- ✓ Last Day to Initiate Application: **December 31st, 2025**
- ✓ Last Day to Initiate USSF Application: **November 30th, 2025**
- ✓ Applicants Must Accept Scholarship by **May 31st, 2026**

## Fitness Requirements

- ✓ Complete the Physical Fitness Assessment, which consists of three events: push-ups, crunches and a 1.5-mile run.
- ✓ If offered a scholarship, you must pass the Physical Fitness Test before the end of your first semester of college.

## Other Scholarship Opportunities

**The Brig. Gen. Charles McGee Leadership Award (CMLA) scholarship is a 2-year automatic award once field training has been completed prior to start of junior year.**

The CMLA currently offers \$18,000 tuition or \$10,000 housing assistance per year to any Cadet not already on scholarship. Cadets will also receive a monthly stipend and a textbook allowance.



### Det 440-specific awards:

We offer several one-time awards of up to \$1,000 each academic year. Please speak with financial aid at your home institution for more opportunities.
