
1ST KS COLORED INFANTRY



HISTORICAL CONTEXT

- Creation of 2nd Kansas Colored Infantry Regiment, summer 1863
- General Order No. 329 October 3, 1863
- In March of 1864 the 1st and 2nd Kansas Colored Infantry regiments were renamed the 79th and 83rd United States Colored Infantry Regiments



HISTORICAL CONTEXT

- Historic sites have led the way in interpreting this history but how can the stories of those interred in national cemeteries provide us with an opportunity to understand the lives of African American veterans who served in the Civil War?
